| constant | Steadfast in purpose or devotion or affection. <i>The constant background noise of the city.</i> |
| <u>continual</u> | Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>His plane went down after continual attacks.</i> |
| continuous | Continuing in time or space without interruption. <i>The whole performance is enacted in one continuous movement.</i> |

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| endless | Having no known beginning and presumably no end. <i>An endless chain.</i> |

| inexorable | Impossible to stop or prevent. <i>Russia's final hour it seemed approached with inexorable certainty.</i> |
| interminable | Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>We got bogged down in interminable discussions.</i> |
| never-ending | Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. |
| perpetual | Denoting or having a position, job, or trophy held for life. <i>The perpetual struggle to maintain standards in a democracy.</i> |
| persistent | Continually recurring to the mind. <i>PCBs are persistent environmental contaminants.</i> |
| relentless | Unceasingly intense. <i>The relentless heat of the desert.</i> |
| steady | Firmly fixed, supported, or balanced; not shaking or moving. <i>She tried to keep her voice steady.</i> |
| sustained | (of an electric arc) continuous. <i>Several years of sustained economic growth.</i> |
| unabating | Not weakening or losing intensity. <i>Unabating enthusiasm.</i> |
| unbroken | (of farmland) not plowed. <i>Unbroken promises.</i> |
| unceasing | Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i> |
| unending | Having or seeming to have no end. <i>Unending demands.</i> |
| unrelenting | Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>The heat was unrelenting.</i> |
| unrelieved | Not lessened or diminished. <i>Unrelieved suffering.</i> |
| unsparing | Not forbearing; ruthless. <i>Unsparing generosity.</i> |
| unyielding | Stubbornly unyielding T S Eliot. <i>His unyielding faith.</i> |

| <u>immortal</u> | An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>Shakespeare is one of the immortals.</i> |

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| incessant | (of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i> |
| incessantly | With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i> |
| interminable | Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An interminable sermon.</i> |
| lasting | Lasting a long time without change. <i>They left a lasting impression.</i> |
| nonstop | (of a journey especially a flight) occurring without stops. <i>How many nonstops are there to Dallas.</i> |
| perennial | A perennial plant. <i>Perennial efforts to stipulate the requirements.</i> |
| permanence | The state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely. <i>The clarity and permanence of the dyes.</i> |
| permanent | Not capable of being reversed or returned to the original condition. <i>Damage was not thought to be permanent.</i> |
| perpetual | Never ending or changing. <i>Their perpetual money worries.</i> |
| perpetuity | The property of being perpetual (seemingly ceaseless). <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i> |
| persistent | Stubbornly unyielding. <i>Persistent rain will affect many areas.</i> |
| seriatim | Taking one subject after another in regular order; point by point. <i>It is proposed to deal with these matters seriatim.</i> |
| timeless | Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. <i>Antiques add to the timeless atmosphere of the dining room.</i> |
| unceasing | Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Man s unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.</i> |
| unceasingly | With unflagging resolve. |
| unchanging | Not changing; remaining the same. <i>The party stood for unchanging principles.</i> |
| uninterrupted | Continuing in time or space without interruption- James Jeans. <i>The window gives an uninterrupted view of the mountains.</i> |
