ceaseless	Constant and unending. <i>The ceaseless thunder of surf.</i>
constant	Steadfast in purpose or devotion or affection. <i>The constant background noise of the city.</i>
continual	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>His plane went down after continual attacks.</i>
continuous	Continuing in time or space without interruption. <i>The whole performance is enacted in one continuous movement.</i>

endless	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. <i>An endless chain.</i>
incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.</i>
inexorable	Impossible to stop or prevent. <i>Russia's final hour it seemed approached with inexorable certainty.</i>
interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>We got bogged down in interminable discussions.</i>
never-ending	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
perpetual	Denoting or having a position, job, or trophy held for life. <i>The perpetual struggle to maintain standards in a democracy.</i>
persistent	Continually recurring to the mind. <i>PCBs are persistent environmental contaminants.</i>
<u>relentless</u>	Unceasingly intense. <i>The relentless heat of the desert.</i>
<u>steady</u>	Firmly fixed, supported, or balanced; not shaking or moving. <i>She tried to keep her voice steady.</i>
sustained	(of an electric arc) continuous. <i>Several years of sustained economic growth.</i>
unabating	Not weakening or losing intensity. <i>Unabating enthusiasm.</i>
<u>unbroken</u>	(of farmland) not plowed. <i>Unbroken promises.</i>
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
<u>unending</u>	Having or seeming to have no end. <i>Unending demands.</i>
<u>unrelenting</u>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>The heat was unrelenting.</i>
unrelieved	Not lessened or diminished. <i>Unrelieved suffering.</i>
unsparing	Not forbearing; ruthless. <i>Unsparing generosity.</i>
unyielding	Stubbornly unyielding T S Eliot. <i>His unyielding faith.</i>

changeless	Remaining the same for indefinitely long times. <i>Changeless truths.</i>
constant	Steadfast in purpose or devotion or affection. <i>Constant as the northern star.</i>
<u>continual</u>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>The continual banging of the shutters.</i>
<u>continually</u>	Seemingly without interruption. <i>This information is continually updated.</i>
continuous	Forming a series with no exceptions or reversals. <i>Lived in continuous fear.</i>
continuously	Without interruption or gaps. <i>These images loop continuously.</i>
endless	Having or seeming to have no end or limit. <i>An endless conversation.</i>
<u>enduring</u>	Unceasing. <i>An enduring disposition.</i>
<u>eternal</u>	(of truths, values, or questions) valid for all time; essentially unchanging. <i>Eternal nagging demands.</i>
<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Did you ever smoke.</i>
everlasting	Any of various plants of various genera of the family Compositae having flowers that can be dried without loss of form or color. <i>Life everlasting.</i>
<u>immortal</u>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>Shakespeare is one of the immortals.</i>

incessant	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
incessantly	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
<u>lasting</u>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>They left a lasting impression.</i>
<u>nonstop</u>	(of a journey especially a flight) occurring without stops. <i>How many nonstops are there to Dallas.</i>
<u>perennial</u>	A perennial plant. <i>Perennial efforts to stipulate the requirements.</i>
permanence	The state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely. <i>The clarity and permanence of the dyes.</i>
<u>permanent</u>	Not capable of being reversed or returned to the original condition. <i>Damage was not thought to be permanent.</i>
perpetual	Never ending or changing. <i>Their perpetual money worries.</i>
<u>perpetuity</u>	The property of being perpetual (seemingly ceaseless). <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
persistent	Stubbornly unyielding. <i>Persistent rain will affect many areas.</i>
seriatim	Taking one subject after another in regular order; point by point. <i>It is proposed to deal with these matters seriatim.</i>
<u>timeless</u>	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. <i>Antiques add to the timeless atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Man's unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
<u>unchanging</u>	Not changing; remaining the same. <i>The party stood for unchanging principles.</i>
uninterrupted	Continuing in time or space without interruption- James Jeans. <i>The window gives an uninterrupted view of the mountains.</i>
