<b>never-ending</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
<b>perpetual</b>	Denoting or having a position, job, or trophy held for life. <i>The <b>perpetual</b> struggle to maintain standards in a democracy.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Continually recurring to the mind. <i>PCBs are <b>persistent</b> environmental contaminants.</i>
<b>relentless</b>	Unceasingly intense. <i>The <b>relentless</b> heat of the desert.</i>
<b>steady</b>	Firmly fixed, supported, or balanced; not shaking or moving. <i>She tried to keep her voice <b>steady</b>.</i>
<b>sustained</b>	(of an electric arc) continuous. <i>Several years of <b>sustained</b> economic growth.</i>
<b>unabating</b>	Not weakening or losing intensity. <i><b>Unabating</b> enthusiasm.</i>
<b>unbroken</b>	(of farmland) not plowed. <i><b>Unbroken</b> promises.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
<b>unending</b>	Having or seeming to have no end. <i><b>Unending</b> demands.</i>
<b>unrelenting</b>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>The heat was <b>unrelenting</b>.</i>
<b>unrelieved</b>	Not lessened or diminished. <i><b>Unrelieved</b> suffering.</i>
<b>unsparing</b>	Not forbearing; ruthless. <i><b>Unsparing</b> generosity.</i>
<b>unyielding</b>	Stubbornly unyielding T S Eliot. <i>His <b>unyielding</b> faith.</i>
