### **Definitions of "Unrequited" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “unrequited” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not returned in kind.*
- *(of a feeling, especially love) not returned.*



## Synonyms of "Unrequited" as an adjective (2 Words)

**unanswered** Not answered or responded to.  
***Unanswered** letters.*

**unreciprocated** Not returned in kind.  
*His feelings for her were **unreciprocated**.*



## Usage Examples of "Unrequited" as an adjective

- *He's been pining with unrequited love.*
- *Unrequited (unanswered) love.*



## Associations of "Unrequited" (30 Words)

- amatory** Relating to or induced by sexual love or desire.  
*Her **amatory** affairs.*
- attachment** An extra part or extension that is or may be attached to something to perform a particular function.  
***Attachment** to a formal agenda.*
- cloying** Excessively sweet, rich, or sentimental, especially to a disgusting or sickening degree.  
*A romantic rather **cloying** story.*

<b>conjugal</b>	Relating to marriage or the relationship between a married couple. <b>Conjugal</b> loyalty.
<b>connubial</b>	Of or relating to marriage or to the relationship between a wife and husband. <i>Their <b>connubial</b> bed.</i>
<b>consummate</b>	Make perfect; bring to perfection. <i>They did not <b>consummate</b> their marriage until months after it took place.</i>
<b>darling</b>	A lovable or endearing person. <i>His <b>darling</b> wife.</i>
<b>eagerly</b>	With eagerness; in an eager manner. <i>Fans of the show are <b>eagerly</b> awaiting the new season.</i>
<b>enthusiast</b>	An ardent and enthusiastic supporter of some person or activity. <i>A sports car <b>enthusiast</b>.</i>
<b>favorite</b>	Appealing to the general public. <i>That book is one of my <b>favorites</b>.</i>
<b>fixation</b>	An obsessive interest in or feeling about someone or something. <i>During the period of total blindness there was a complete absence of visual <b>fixation</b>.</i>
<b>friendship</b>	The state of being friends (or friendly). <i>The foreign ministers extended to eastern Europe the hand of <b>friendship</b>.</i>
<b>husband</b>	Use cautiously and frugally. <i>She <b>husbanded</b> their financial resources through difficult times.</i>
<b>infatuation</b>	An intense but short-lived passion or admiration for someone or something. <i>He had developed an <b>infatuation</b> with the girl.</i>
<b>longing</b>	Prolonged unfulfilled desire or need. <i>Miranda felt a wistful <b>longing</b> for the old days.</i>
<b>love</b>	Be enamored or in love with. <i>She was his first <b>love</b>.</i>
<b>matrimony</b>	The ceremony or sacrament of marriage. <i>The joys of <b>matrimony</b>.</i>
<b>obsession</b>	The state of being obsessed with someone or something. <i>He was in the grip of an <b>obsession</b> he was powerless to resist.</i>
<b>paramour</b>	A woman who cohabits with an important man.
<b>passionate</b>	Arising from intense feelings of sexual love. <i>He s <b>passionate</b> about football.</i>
<b>philander</b>	Have amorous affairs; of men. <i>Married men who <b>philander</b>.</i>

<b>platonic</b>	Of or relating to or characteristic of Plato or his philosophy. <i>Their relationship is purely <b>platonic</b>.</i>
<b><u>possessive</u></b>	A possessive word or form. <b>Possessive</b> pronouns.
<b>sickness</b>	The feeling or fact of being affected with nausea or vomiting. <i>She was absent through <b>sickness</b>.</i>
<b>sisterhood</b>	The relationship between sisters. <i>Canadian feminists acknowledge their <b>sisterhood</b> with women around the globe.</i>
<b><u>tempt</u></b>	Give rise to a desire by being attractive or inviting. <i>There'll always be someone <b>tempted</b> by the rich pickings of poaching.</i>
<b><u>undying</u></b>	Never dying. <i>Promises of <b>undying</b> love.</i>
<b>wed</b>	Take in marriage. <i>They <b>wed</b> a week after meeting.</i>
