bad-tempered	Annoyed and irritable.
blue	Of a ski run of the second lowest level of difficulty as indicated by blue markers positioned along it. A blue family.

<u>cantankerous</u>	Bad-tempered, argumentative, and uncooperative. <i>A cantankerous and venomous tongued old lady.</i>
churlish	Rude in a mean-spirited and surly way. <i>It seems churlish to complain.</i>
crabbed	Annoyed and irritable. <i>Crabbed legal language.</i>
crabby	Irritable. <i>A rather crabby old man.</i>
<u>cross</u>	Extending or lying across in a crosswise direction at right angles to the long axis. <i>Cross members should be all steel.</i>
crotchety	Irritable. <i>He was tired and crotchety.</i>
crusty	Having a hardened crust as a covering. <i>Crusty remarks.</i>
dejected	Sad and depressed; dispirited. <i>He stood in the street looking dejected.</i>
depressed	(of a place or economic activity) suffering the damaging effects of a lack of demand or employment. <i>Depressed by the loss of his job.</i>
despondent	In low spirits from loss of hope or courage. <i>She grew more and more despondent.</i>
dismal	(of a person or their mood) gloomy. <i>The first dismal dispiriting days of November.</i>
doleful	Filled with or evoking sadness. <i>He could be struck off with doleful consequences.</i>
dour	Stubbornly unyielding- T.S.Eliot. <i>A hard dour humourless fanatic.</i>
<u>down</u>	Denoting a flavour variety of stable quark having relatively low mass and an electric charge of $-\frac{1}{3}$ In the Standard Model protons and neutrons are composed of up and down quarks. <i>The down staircase.</i>
downcast	Directed downward. <i>Her modestly downcast eyes.</i>
<u>gloomy</u>	Dark or poorly lit, especially so as to appear depressing or frightening. <i>The gloomy forest.</i>
glowering	Showing a brooding ill humor.

glum	Showing a brooding ill humor- Bruce Bli. <i>A glum hopeless shrug.</i>
grouchy	Irritable and bad-tempered; grumpy; complaining. <i>The old man grew sulky and grouchy.</i>
grumpy	Bad-tempered and irritable. <i>His performance as the grumpy gateman.</i>
humourless	Lacking humor- Truman Capote. <i>A rather humourless performance.</i>
ill-humoured	Brusque and surly and forbidding.
ill-tempered	Annoyed and irritable.
in a bad mood	Directed or bound inward.
in low spirits	Currently fashionable.
irritable	Abnormally sensitive to a stimulus. <i>She was tired and irritable.</i>
low	Used of sounds and voices low in pitch or frequency. <i>The sun was low in the sky.</i>
low-spirited	Filled with melancholy and despondency.
lugubrious	Looking or sounding sad and dismal. <i>His face looked even more lugubrious than usual.</i>
melancholic	Feeling or expressing pensive sadness. <i>Her melancholic smile.</i>
melancholy	Having a feeling of melancholy sad and pensive. <i>The melancholy tone of her writing.</i>
miserable	Deserving or inciting pity- Galsworthy. <i>A lousy dollar a day could any government be more miserable.</i>
moody	(of a person) given to unpredictable changes of mood, especially sudden bouts of gloominess or sullenness. <i>His moody adolescent brother.</i>
mournful	Filled with or evoking sadness. <i>Mournful news.</i>
peevish	Having or showing an irritable disposition. <i>A thin peevish voice.</i>
pessimistic	Expecting the worst possible outcome. <i>He was pessimistic about the prospects.</i>
saturnine	Bitter or scornful- Oscar Wilde. <i>The face was saturnine and swarthy and the sensual lips twisted with disdain.</i>

scowling	Sullen or unfriendly in appearance.
snappish	Apt to speak irritably. <i>She was often snappish with the children.</i>
sober	Lacking brightness or color; dull. Sober Puritan grey.
sombre	Grave or even gloomy in character. <i>He looked at her with a sombre expression.</i>
sour	In an unpalatable state. <i>The kitchen smelled of sour milk.</i>
sulky	Morose, bad-tempered, and resentful; refusing to be cooperative or cheerful. <i>She had a sultry sulky mouth.</i>
sullen	Darkened by clouds. <i>A sullen crowd.</i>
surly	Bad-tempered and unfriendly. <i>The porter left with a surly expression.</i>
taciturn	Habitually reserved and uncommunicative. <i>After such gatherings she would be taciturn and morose.</i>
testy	Easily irritated or annoyed. <i>His testy disapproving father.</i>
uncommunicative	Not inclined to talk or give information or express opinions. <i>The uncommunicative Emily disappeared.</i>
unhappy	Generalized feeling of distress. <i>An unhappy coincidence.</i>
unsmiling	Not smiling. <i>A large unsmiling woman.</i>
unsociable	Not inclined to society or companionship. <i>An unsociable neighborhood.</i>
waspish	Very irritable. <i>He had a waspish tongue.</i>
with a long face	Of relatively great height- Sherwood Anderson.
