boundless	Seemingly boundless in amount number degree or especially extent. <i>Enthusiasts who devote boundless energy to their hobby.</i>
<u>delirious</u>	Experiencing delirium. <i>There was a great roar from the delirious crowd.</i>
excited	Of or in an energy state higher than the normal or ground state. <i>The excited atom returns to its former energy state and emits light or other radiation.</i>
<u>frantic</u>	Distraught with fear, anxiety, or other emotion. <i>She was frantic with worry.</i>
mad	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>She pictured loved ones mad with anxiety about her.</i>
out of control	Being out or having grown cold.
out of hand	Not worth considering as a possibility.
<u>unbounded</u>	Seemingly boundless in amount, number, degree, or especially extent. <i>The possibilities are unbounded.</i>
<u>unbridled</u>	Uncontrolled; unconstrained. <i>A moment of unbridled ambition.</i>
<u>unchecked</u>	(especially of something undesirable) not controlled or restrained. <i>Prices rose unchecked hitting the poor worst of all.</i>
unconfined	(of joy or excitement) very great. <i>Sows should be unconfined at farrowing.</i>
unconstrained	Free from constraint. <i>Unconstrained growth.</i>
<u>uncontrollable</u>	Of persons. <i>Her brother had an uncontrollable temper.</i>
<u>uncontrolled</u>	Not being under control; out of control. <i>Some uncontrolled children rather marred the proceedings.</i>
undisciplined	Not subjected to discipline. <i>Undisciplined behavior.</i>
unfettered	Unrestrained or uninhibited. <i>Unfettered artistic genius.</i>
unhampered	Not impeded or encumbered. <i>An outlet for healthy and unhampered action.</i>
<u>unimpeded</u>	Not obstructed or hindered. <i>A time of unimpeded growth.</i>

<u>uninhibited</u>	Not inhibited or restrained. <i>A naturally uninhibited sexuality.</i>
unlimited	That cannot be entirely consumed or used up. <i>To start with a theory of unlimited freedom is to end up with unlimited despotism.</i>
unrestricted	Not restricted or modified in meaning. <i>Unrestricted access to both military bases.</i>
unshackled	Not bound by shackles and chains. <i>He had handcuffs on his wrists but his feet were unshackled.</i>
unsuppressed	Not restrained or repressed. <i>Unsuppressed rage.</i>
untrammelled	Not confined or limited- Russell Lord- Farley Mowat. <i>A mind untrammelled by convention.</i>

continually	Seemingly without interruption. <i>This information is continually updated.</i>
continue	Continue talking. <i>He was unable to continue with his job.</i>
continuously	With unflagging resolve. <i>These images loop continuously.</i>

<u>delirious</u>	In a state of wild excitement or ecstasy. <i>A crowd of delirious baseball fans.</i>
endless	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An endless chain.</i>
<u>eternal</u>	Used to refer to an everlasting or universal spirit, as represented by God. <i>Fear of eternal damnation.</i>
<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>He toyed with his ever present cigar.</i>
<u>grinding</u>	A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i>The roasting and grinding of grain usually barley for use in brewing.</i>
illimitable	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>The illimitable human capacity for evil.</i>
<u>immortal</u>	An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome. <i>Shakespeare is one of the immortals.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.</i>
indefinitely	To an indefinite extent; for an indefinite time. <i>Talks cannot go on indefinitely.</i>
<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>The infinite ingenuity of man.</i>
interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
<u>limitless</u>	Without end, limit, or boundary. <i>The limitless reaches of outer space.</i>
measureless	Having no bounds or limits; unlimited. <i>Otto had measureless charm.</i>
overweening	Presumptuously arrogant- S.V.Benet- NY Times. <i>Overweening greed.</i>
perpetual	Occurring repeatedly; so frequent as to seem endless and uninterrupted. <i>A perpetual bond.</i>
<u>perpetuity</u>	A restriction making an interest in land inalienable perpetually or for a period beyond certain limits fixed by law. <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>
<u>unbounded</u>	Seemingly boundless in amount, number, degree, or especially extent. <i>The possibilities are unbounded.</i>
<u>unbridled</u>	Not restrained or controlled. <i>A moment of unbridled ambition.</i>

- unchecked** (especially of something undesirable) not controlled or restrained.
*The broadcast was sloppy it was **unchecked** there was no investigation of the facts.*
- unfettered** Unrestrained or uninhibited.
***Unfettered** artistic genius.*
- uninhibited** Not having been restrained or suppressed.
*A lively and **uninhibited** girl.*
- unlimited** That cannot be entirely consumed or used up.
*To start with a theory of **unlimited** freedom is to end up with **unlimited** despotism.*
- unreserved** Frank and open.
*He has had their **unreserved** support.*
- unrestricted** Never having had security classification.
