### Definitions of "Unsatisfied" as an adjective

- *Not having been satisfied.*
- *Not satisfied.*
- *Worried and uneasy.*

### Synonyms of "Unsatisfied" as an adjective (10 Words)

- disaffected** Dissatisfied, especially with people in authority or a system of control.  
*A military plot by **disaffected** elements in the army.*
- disappointed** Sad or displeased because someone or something has failed to fulfil one’s hopes or expectations.  
*I m **disappointed** in you Mary.*
- discontented** Dissatisfied, especially with one’s circumstances.  
*The ranks of the **discontented** were swelled by returning soldiers.*
- disquieted** Afflicted with or marked by anxious uneasiness or trouble or grief.  
*Spent many **disquieted** moments.*

<b>malcontent</b>	Discontented as toward authority. <i>The <b>malcontent</b> generals saw their role as leaders of this counter revolution.</i>
<b>restless</b>	Worried and uneasy. <i>The audience grew <b>restless</b> and inattentive.</i>
<b>ungratified</b>	Worried and uneasy.
<b>unhappy</b>	Generalized feeling of distress. <i><b>Unhappy</b> over her departure.</i>
<b>unsated</b>	Not having been satisfied.
<b>unsatiated</b>	Not having been satisfied.

## Usage Examples of "Unsatisfied" as an adjective

- *The compromise left all sides unsatisfied.*

## Associations of "Unsatisfied" (30 Words)

<b>antisocial</b>	Relating to or having an antisocial personality disorder. <i>He s not <b>antisocial</b> just shy.</i>
<b>bitterly</b>	In an angry, hurt, or resentful way. <i>Its humour is cutting and <b>bitterly</b> sarcastic.</i>
<b>complain</b>	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>My mother <b>complains</b> all day.</i>
<b>condemnation</b>	The expression of very strong disapproval; censure. <i>There was strong international <b>condemnation</b> of the attack.</i>
<b>debacle</b>	A sound defeat. <i>The only man to reach double figures in the second innings <b>debacle</b>.</i>
<b>defeated</b>	People who are defeated. <i>The Romans had no pity for the <b>defeated</b>.</i>
<b>dejected</b>	Sad and depressed; dispirited. <i>Is <b>dejected</b> but trying to look cheerful.</i>
<b>disaffected</b>	Dissatisfied, especially with people in authority or a system of control. <i>A military plot by <b>disaffected</b> elements in the army.</i>
<b>disappointed</b>	Sad or displeased because someone or something has failed to fulfil one's hopes or expectations. <i><b>Disappointed</b> expectations and thwarted ambitions.</i>

<b><u>disapprove</u></b>	Officially refuse to agree to. <i>A company may take power to <b>disapprove</b> the transfer of shares.</i>
<b>discontent</b>	Make dissatisfied. <i>Saw many <b>discontent</b> faces in the room.</i>
<b>discontented</b>	Showing or experiencing dissatisfaction or restless longing. <i>The ranks of the <b>discontented</b> were swelled by returning soldiers.</i>
<b><u>disgruntled</u></b>	In a state of sulky dissatisfaction. <i>Judges receive letters from <b>disgruntled</b> members of the public.</i>
<b><u>disillusioned</u></b>	Freed from illusion. <i>The minority groups were completely <b>disillusioned</b> with the party.</i>
<b>dislike</b>	Have or feel a dislike or distaste for. <i>She <b>disliked</b> any kind of unnecessary rudeness.</i>
<b><u>displeasure</u></b>	A feeling of annoyance or disapproval. <i>Not for worlds would I do aught that might <b>displeasure</b> thee.</i>
<b><u>dissatisfied</u></b>	In a state of sulky dissatisfaction. <i><b>Dissatisfied</b> customers.</i>
<b>foiled</b>	Disappointingly unsuccessful. <i>Their <b>foiled</b> attempt to capture Calais.</i>
<b><u>frustrated</u></b>	Disappointingly unsuccessful. <i>Jealousies and <b>frustrated</b> passions.</i>
<b><u>insatiable</u></b>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>So <b>insatiable</b> a gourmand as myself.</i>
<b>malcontent</b>	A person who is discontented or disgusted. <i>The <b>malcontent</b> generals saw their role as leaders of this counter revolution.</i>
<b><u>pessimist</u></b>	A person who expects the worst. <i>The <b>pessimists</b> point to ways in which life has deteriorated.</i>
<b><u>restless</u></b>	Ceaselessly in motion. <i>A <b>restless</b> night.</i>
<b>unacceptable</b>	Not satisfactory or allowable. <i>The coach told his players that defeat was <b>unacceptable</b>.</i>
<b>unfulfilled</b>	Not carried out or brought to completion. <i><b>Unfulfilled</b> and uneasy men.</i>
<b>unhappy</b>	Not happy. <i><b>Unhappy</b> caravans straggling afoot through swamps and canebrakes.</i>

- unlucky** Having, bringing, or resulting from bad luck.  
*An **unlucky** defeat.*
- unsatisfactory** Not giving satisfaction.  
*Her performance proved to be **unsatisfactory**.*
- unsuccessful** Not successful.  
*An **unsuccessful** attempt to enter Parliament.*
- wretched** Used to express anger or annoyance.  
*A **wretched** life.*
