ungratified Worried and uneasy.

unhappy Generalized feeling of distress. **Unhappy** over her departure.

unsated Not having been satisfied.unsatiated Not having been satisfied.

A company may take power to **disapprove** the transfer of shares.

disgruntled In a state of sulky dissatisfaction.

Judges receive letters from **disgruntled** members of the public.

disillusioned Freed from illusion.

The minority groups were completely **disillusioned** with the party.

dislike Have or feel a dislike or distaste for.

She **dislike**d any kind of unnecessary rudeness.

displeasure A feeling of annoyance or disapproval.

Not for worlds would I do aught that might **displeasure** thee.

dissatisfied In a state of sulky dissatisfaction.

Dissatisfied customers.

foiled Disappointingly unsuccessful.

Their **foiled** attempt to capture Calais.

frustrated Disappointingly unsuccessful.

Jealousies and **frustrated** passions.

Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something

insatiable especially sex.

So **insatiable** a gourmand as myself.

A person who is discontented or disgusted.
