Synonyms of "Unsatisfied" as an adjective (10 Words)

- disaffected** Dissatisfied, especially with people in authority or a system of control.
*A military plot by **disaffected** elements in the army.*
- disappointed** Sad or displeased because someone or something has failed to fulfil one’s hopes or expectations.
*I m **disappointed** in you Mary.*
- discontented** Dissatisfied, especially with one’s circumstances.
*The ranks of the **discontented** were swelled by returning soldiers.*
- disquieted** Afflicted with or marked by anxious uneasiness or trouble or grief.
*Spent many **disquieted** moments.*

malcontent	Discontented as toward authority. <i>The malcontent generals saw their role as leaders of this counter revolution.</i>
restless	Worried and uneasy. <i>The audience grew restless and inattentive.</i>
ungratified	Worried and uneasy.
unhappy	Generalized feeling of distress. <i>Unhappy over her departure.</i>
unsated	Not having been satisfied.
unsatiated	Not having been satisfied.

Usage Examples of "Unsatisfied" as an adjective

- *The compromise left all sides unsatisfied.*

Associations of "Unsatisfied" (30 Words)

antisocial	Relating to or having an antisocial personality disorder. <i>He s not antisocial just shy.</i>
bitterly	In an angry, hurt, or resentful way. <i>Its humour is cutting and bitterly sarcastic.</i>
complain	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>My mother complains all day.</i>
condemnation	The expression of very strong disapproval; censure. <i>There was strong international condemnation of the attack.</i>
debacle	A sound defeat. <i>The only man to reach double figures in the second innings debacle.</i>
defeated	People who are defeated. <i>The Romans had no pity for the defeated.</i>
dejected	Sad and depressed; dispirited. <i>Is dejected but trying to look cheerful.</i>
disaffected	Dissatisfied, especially with people in authority or a system of control. <i>A military plot by disaffected elements in the army.</i>
disappointed	Sad or displeased because someone or something has failed to fulfil one's hopes or expectations. <i>Disappointed expectations and thwarted ambitions.</i>

<u>disapprove</u>	Officially refuse to agree to. <i>A company may take power to disapprove the transfer of shares.</i>
discontent	Make dissatisfied. <i>Saw many discontent faces in the room.</i>
discontented	Showing or experiencing dissatisfaction or restless longing. <i>The ranks of the discontented were swelled by returning soldiers.</i>
<u>disgruntled</u>	In a state of sulky dissatisfaction. <i>Judges receive letters from disgruntled members of the public.</i>
<u>disillusioned</u>	Freed from illusion. <i>The minority groups were completely disillusioned with the party.</i>
dislike	Have or feel a dislike or distaste for. <i>She disliked any kind of unnecessary rudeness.</i>
<u>displeasure</u>	A feeling of annoyance or disapproval. <i>Not for worlds would I do aught that might displeasure thee.</i>
<u>dissatisfied</u>	In a state of sulky dissatisfaction. <i>Dissatisfied customers.</i>
foiled	Disappointingly unsuccessful. <i>Their foiled attempt to capture Calais.</i>
<u>frustrated</u>	Disappointingly unsuccessful. <i>Jealousies and frustrated passions.</i>
<u>insatiable</u>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>So insatiable a gourmand as myself.</i>
malcontent	A person who is discontented or disgusted. <i>The malcontent generals saw their role as leaders of this counter revolution.</i>
<u>pessimist</u>	A person who expects the worst. <i>The pessimists point to ways in which life has deteriorated.</i>
<u>restless</u>	Ceaselessly in motion. <i>A restless night.</i>
unacceptable	Not satisfactory or allowable. <i>The coach told his players that defeat was unacceptable.</i>
unfulfilled	Not carried out or brought to completion. <i>Unfulfilled and uneasy men.</i>
unhappy	Not happy. <i>Unhappy caravans straggling afoot through swamps and canebrakes.</i>

- unlucky** Having, bringing, or resulting from bad luck.
*An **unlucky** defeat.*
- unsatisfactory** Not giving satisfaction.
*Her performance proved to be **unsatisfactory**.*
- unsuccessful** Not successful.
*An **unsuccessful** attempt to enter Parliament.*
- wretched** Used to express anger or annoyance.
*A **wretched** life.*
