incomplete Not yet finished.

Political consequences of **incomplete** military success.

Of low or inferior quality.

<u>inferior</u> Ulcers located in the **inferior** and posterior wall of the

duodenum.

insufficient Not enough; inadequate.

**Insufficient** funds.

Inadequate in amount or degree.

**lacking** Workers were asked in what way they found their managers

lacking.

limited Denoting a limited company used after a company name.

**Limited** war.

**not acceptable** Worthy of acceptance or satisfactory.

**not good enough** Not left to spoil.

not up to par Open.

**not up to standard** Out of bed.

patchy Irregular or uneven in quality, texture, etc.

Your coursework was **patchy**.

Not sufficient to meet a need.

The area was **poor** in timber and coal.

**restricted**Restricted in meaning as e g man in a tall man.

Western scientists had only **restricted** access to the site.

**second-rate** Moderate to inferior in quality.

Mean and unworthy and despicable.

**shabby**A **shabby** fellow in slippers and an undershirt.



**shoddy** Cheap and shoddy Judith Crist.

**Shoddy** business practices.

**sketchy** Dishonest or disreputable.

A **sketchy** account.

**substandard**Below the usual or required standard.

**Substandard** housing.

Not satisfactory or allowable.

unacceptable

Not finished or concluded; incomplete.

**unfinished** The garage door can be supplied **unfinished** for you to paint

unpolished Lacking social polish.

unsound Physically unsound or diseased.
