- (of a passage for translation in a test or examination) not previously read or prepared.
- Not foreseen or predicted.

unobtrusive Not conspicuous or attracting attention.

unopened Not opened.

Unopened Christmas presents.

Not in keeping with accepted standards of what is right or proper in polite

untoward society.

Made a place for themselves under the most **untoward** conditions.

Take (someone) to their seats, as in theaters or auditoriums.

The railways **usher**ed in an era of cheap mass travel.

The images seen on a television screen.
