- *Not seen or observed.*
- *Not seen or perceived.*
- *Not seen or noticed.*
- *Not anticipated.*
- *(of a passage for translation in a test or examination) not previously read or prepared.*
- *Not foreseen or predicted.*



Synonyms of "Unseen" as an adjective (20 Words)

- camouflaged** Made invisible by means of protective coloring.
- concealed** Not accessible to view.
*He spoke with barely **concealed** anger.*
- covered** Overlaid or spread or topped with or enclosed within something; sometimes used as a combining form.
*Women with **covered** faces.*
- hidden** Not accessible to view.
*Concealed or **hidden** damage.*
- imperceptible** So slight, gradual, or subtle as not to be perceived.
*An **imperceptible** drop in temperature.*
- invisible** Impossible or nearly impossible to see; imperceptible by the eye.
***Invisible** mending.*
- masked** (of one's true character or feelings) concealed.
*The barely **masked** anger in their tone.*
- not visible** Capable of being seen; or open to easy view.

obscured	Not clearly understood or expressed-Anatole Broyard- P.A.So.
out of sight	No longer fashionable.
out of the blue	Directed outward or serving to direct something outward. Not expected or predicted.
unanticipated	<i>One of the unanticipated gains of the reforms has been the shift of emphasis to primary care.</i>
undetactable	Barely able to be perceived. <i>In the other two patients the antibodies were undetactable after one year.</i>
<u>unforeseen</u>	Not anticipated or predicted. <i>Unforeseen</i> circumstances.
unlooked-for	Not anticipated- H.W.Glidden.
<u>unnoticeable</u>	Not drawing attention. <i>An unnoticeable cigarette burn on the carpet.</i>
<u>unnoticed</u>	Not noticed. <i>Hoped his departure had passed unnoticed.</i>
unobserved	Not observed. <i>Their courtship has not gone unobserved by Giles.</i>
unrevealed	Not revealed; secret. <i>Some feelings can run so deep that they are better left unrevealed.</i>
<u>veiled</u>	Having or as if having a veil or concealing cover. <i>A veiled woman.</i>

blind

Make blind by putting the eyes out.
*Wines were tasted **blind**.*

disguised

Having its true character concealed with the intent of misleading.
*The **disguised** form of aggression available to the powerless against the powerful.*

esoteric

Intended for or likely to be understood by only a small number of people with a specialized knowledge or interest.
*A compilation of **esoteric** philosophical theories.*

eye

The region of the face surrounding the eyes.
*Strands of glass tiny enough to pass through the **eye** of a needle.*

inconspicuous

Not clearly visible or attracting attention.
*He pushed the string through an **inconspicuous** hole.*

<u>invisible</u>	Invisible exports and imports. <i>Invisible exports.</i>
macroscopic	Visible to the naked eye; not microscopic.
<u>neglect</u>	The state of something that has been unused and neglected. <i>The house was in a terrible state of neglect.</i>
<u>obscure</u>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>The distinction was obscured.</i>
offstage	(in a theatre) not taking place on the stage and so not visible to the audience. <i>Screams were heard offstage.</i>
recondite	(of a subject or knowledge) little known; abstruse. <i>The book is full of recondite information.</i>
<u>remaining</u>	Not used up. <i>Saved the remaining sandwiches for supper.</i>
seeing	The action of seeing someone or something. <i>He had given the seeing as fair.</i>
sight	Take aim by looking through the sights of a gun. <i>We are all equal in the sight of God.</i>
sightless	Unable to see; blind. <i>Blank sightless eyes.</i>
soundproof	Impervious to, or not penetrable by, sound. <i>The rehearsal room s well soundproofed.</i>
<u>survivor</u>	A joint tenant who has the right to the whole estate on the other's death. <i>He left his farm to his survivors.</i>
<u>undetected</u>	Not detected or discovered. <i>They feared some undetected trace of poison.</i>
undiagnosed	Not diagnosed or having been subject to diagnosis. <i>Undiagnosed disease.</i>
<u>undiscovered</u>	Not discovered. <i>The novel had lain undiscovered for years among his papers.</i>
unknown	An unknown person or thing. <i>His whereabouts are unknown to his family.</i>
<u>unnamed</u>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>The unnamed man was found unconscious.</i>
<u>unnoticeable</u>	Not noticeable; not drawing attention- J.G.Cozzens. <i>The reverberation will be so slight as to be unnoticeable.</i>

<u>unnoticed</u>	Not noticed. <i>A deliberate kick that went unnoticed by the referee.</i>
unobserved	Not seen or observed. <i>Managed to slip away unobserved.</i>
<u>unobtrusive</u>	Not conspicuous or attracting attention. <i>The service was unobtrusive and efficient.</i>
unopened	Not opened. <i>Unopened Christmas presents.</i>
<u>untoward</u>	Not in keeping with accepted standards of what is right or proper in polite society. <i>Made a place for themselves under the most untoward conditions.</i>
<u>usher</u>	Take (someone) to their seats, as in theaters or auditoriums. <i>The railways ushered in an era of cheap mass travel.</i>
vision	The images seen on a television screen. <i>The runners emerged from the trees into his clear vision.</i>
