## Synonyms of "Unseen" as an adjective (20 Words)

- camouflaged** Made invisible by means of protective coloring.
- concealed** Not accessible to view.  
*He spoke with barely **concealed** anger.*
- covered** Overlaid or spread or topped with or enclosed within something; sometimes used as a combining form.  
*Women with **covered** faces.*
- hidden** Not accessible to view.  
*Concealed or **hidden** damage.*
- imperceptible** So slight, gradual, or subtle as not to be perceived.  
*An **imperceptible** drop in temperature.*
- invisible** Impossible or nearly impossible to see; imperceptible by the eye.  
***Invisible** mending.*
- masked** (of one's true character or feelings) concealed.  
*The barely **masked** anger in their tone.*
- not visible** Capable of being seen; or open to easy view.

<b>obscured</b>	Not clearly understood or expressed-Anatole Broyard- P.A.So.
<b>out of sight</b>	No longer fashionable.
<b>out of the blue</b>	Directed outward or serving to direct something outward. Not expected or predicted.
<b>unanticipated</b>	<i>One of the <b>unanticipated</b> gains of the reforms has been the shift of emphasis to primary care.</i>
<b>undetactable</b>	Barely able to be perceived. <i>In the other two patients the antibodies were <b>undetactable</b> after one year.</i>
<b><u>unforeseen</u></b>	Not anticipated or predicted. <b><i>Unforeseen</i></b> circumstances.
<b>unlooked-for</b>	Not anticipated- H.W.Glidden.
<b><u>unnoticeable</u></b>	Not drawing attention. <i>An <b>unnoticeable</b> cigarette burn on the carpet.</i>
<b><u>unnoticed</u></b>	Not noticed. <i>Hoped his departure had passed <b>unnoticed</b>.</i>
<b>unobserved</b>	Not observed. <i>Their courtship has not gone <b>unobserved</b> by Giles.</i>
<b>unrevealed</b>	Not revealed; secret. <i>Some feelings can run so deep that they are better left <b>unrevealed</b>.</i>
<b><u>veiled</u></b>	Having or as if having a veil or concealing cover. <i>A <b>veiled</b> woman.</i>

## Associations of "Unseen" (30 Words)

### **blind**

Make blind by putting the eyes out.  
*Wines were tasted **blind**.*

### **disguised**

Having its true character concealed with the intent of misleading.  
*The **disguised** form of aggression available to the powerless against the powerful.*

### **esoteric**

Intended for or likely to be understood by only a small number of people with a specialized knowledge or interest.  
*A compilation of **esoteric** philosophical theories.*

### **eye**

The region of the face surrounding the eyes.  
*Strands of glass tiny enough to pass through the **eye** of a needle.*

### **inconspicuous**

Not clearly visible or attracting attention.  
*He pushed the string through an **inconspicuous** hole.*



<b><u>invisible</u></b>	Invisible exports and imports. <i><b>Invisible</b> exports.</i>
<b>macroscopic</b>	Visible to the naked eye; not microscopic.
<b><u>neglect</u></b>	The state of something that has been unused and neglected. <i>The house was in a terrible state of <b>neglect</b>.</i>
<b><u>obscure</u></b>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>The distinction was <b>obscured</b>.</i>
<b>offstage</b>	(in a theatre) not taking place on the stage and so not visible to the audience. <i>Screams were heard <b>offstage</b>.</i>
<b>recondite</b>	(of a subject or knowledge) little known; abstruse. <i>The book is full of <b>recondite</b> information.</i>
<b><u>remaining</u></b>	Not used up. <i>Saved the <b>remaining</b> sandwiches for supper.</i>
<b>seeing</b>	The action of seeing someone or something. <i>He had given the <b>seeing</b> as fair.</i>
<b>sight</b>	Take aim by looking through the sights of a gun. <i>We are all equal in the <b>sight</b> of God.</i>
<b>sightless</b>	Unable to see; blind. <i>Blank <b>sightless</b> eyes.</i>
<b>soundproof</b>	Impervious to, or not penetrable by, sound. <i>The rehearsal room s well <b>soundproofed</b>.</i>
<b><u>survivor</u></b>	A joint tenant who has the right to the whole estate on the other's death. <i>He left his farm to his <b>survivors</b>.</i>
<b><u>undetected</u></b>	Not detected or discovered. <i>They feared some <b>undetected</b> trace of poison.</i>
<b>undiagnosed</b>	Not diagnosed or having been subject to diagnosis. <i><b>Undiagnosed</b> disease.</i>
<b><u>undiscovered</u></b>	Not discovered. <i>The novel had lain <b>undiscovered</b> for years among his papers.</i>
<b>unknown</b>	An unknown person or thing. <i>His whereabouts are <b>unknown</b> to his family.</i>
<b><u>unnamed</u></b>	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>The <b>unnamed</b> man was found unconscious.</i>
<b><u>unnoticeable</u></b>	Not noticeable; not drawing attention- J.G.Cozzens. <i>The reverberation will be so slight as to be <b>unnoticeable</b>.</i>

<b><u>unnoticed</u></b>	Not noticed. <i>A deliberate kick that went <b>unnoticed</b> by the referee.</i>
<b>unobserved</b>	Not seen or observed. <i>Managed to slip away <b>unobserved</b>.</i>
<b><u>unobtrusive</u></b>	Not conspicuous or attracting attention. <i>The service was <b>unobtrusive</b> and efficient.</i>
<b>unopened</b>	Not opened. <i><b>Unopened</b> Christmas presents.</i>
<b><u>untoward</u></b>	Not in keeping with accepted standards of what is right or proper in polite society. <i>Made a place for themselves under the most <b>untoward</b> conditions.</i>
<b><u>usher</u></b>	Take (someone) to their seats, as in theaters or auditoriums. <i>The railways <b>ushered</b> in an era of cheap mass travel.</i>
<b>vision</b>	The images seen on a television screen. <i>The runners emerged from the trees into his clear <b>vision</b>.</i>
