<u>airy</u>	Characterized by lightness and insubstantiality; as impalpable or intangible as air- Thomas Carlyle. <i>Airy gauze curtains.</i>
blasé	Nonchalantly unconcerned.
breezy	Pleasantly windy. The text is written in a <b>breezy</b> matter of fact manner.
calm	(of weather) free from storm or wind. The city was reported to be <b>calm</b> but army patrols remained.
carefree	Free of trouble and worry and care. The <b>carefree</b> days of the holidays.



<u>casual</u>	Without formality of style or manner, in particular (of clothing) suitable for everyday wear rather than formal occasions. A difficult feat performed with <b>casual</b> mastery.
composed	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. The performer seemed completely <b>composed</b> as she stepped onto the stage.
easy	Obtained with little effort or sacrifice, often obtained illegally. An <b>easy</b> job.
equable	Not varying. He could look sterner than his <b>equable</b> temperament would suggest.
equanimous	In full control of your faculties.
free and easy	Unconstrained or not chemically bound in a molecule or not fixed and capable of relatively unrestricted motion.
free from care	Not taken up by scheduled activities.
free from worry	Costing nothing.
frivolous	Not having any serious purpose or value. Rules to stop <b>frivolous</b> lawsuits.
happy-go-lucky	Presaging or likely to bring good luck.
heedless	Marked by or paying little heed or attention. <i>Heedless</i> of danger.
indifferent	Showing no care or concern in attitude or action. An <b>indifferent</b> chemical in a reaction.
lacking concern	Inadequate in amount or degree.
light-hearted	Carefree and happy and lighthearted.
<u>nonchalant</u>	Marked by blithe unconcern. Drove his car with <b>nonchalant</b> abandon.
relaxed	(of a muscle or other body part) not tense. <i>Make sure that your jaw is <b>relaxed</b>.</i>
<u>serene</u>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil. <i>He remained <b>serene</b> in the midst of turbulence.</i>
<u>unconcerned</u>	Not occupied or engaged with. <i>Readers <b>unconcerned</b> with style.</i>
unruffled	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <b>Unruffled</b> water.
untroubled	Free from fear or doubt; easy in mind. A man <b>untroubled</b> by a guilty conscience.



#### **unworried** Free of trouble and worry and care. Foreign investors are largely **unworried** by the government s fall.
