<a href="#">airy</a>	Characterized by lightness and insubstantiality; as impalpable or intangible as air- Thomas Carlyle. <i><b>Airy</b> gauze curtains.</i>
<b>blasé</b>	Nonchalantly unconcerned.
<b>breezy</b>	Pleasantly windy. <i>The text is written in a <b>breezy</b> matter of fact manner.</i>
<b>calm</b>	(of weather) free from storm or wind. <i>The city was reported to be <b>calm</b> but army patrols remained.</i>
<b>carefree</b>	Free of trouble and worry and care. <i>The <b>carefree</b> days of the holidays.</i>

<b><u>casual</u></b>	Without formality of style or manner, in particular (of clothing) suitable for everyday wear rather than formal occasions. <i>A difficult feat performed with <b>casual</b> mastery.</i>
<b>composed</b>	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>The performer seemed completely <b>composed</b> as she stepped onto the stage.</i>
<b>easy</b>	Obtained with little effort or sacrifice, often obtained illegally. <i>An <b>easy</b> job.</i>
<b>equable</b>	Not varying. <i>He could look sterner than his <b>equable</b> temperament would suggest.</i>
<b>equanimous</b>	In full control of your faculties.
<b>free and easy</b>	Unconstrained or not chemically bound in a molecule or not fixed and capable of relatively unrestricted motion.
<b>free from care</b>	Not taken up by scheduled activities.
<b>free from worry</b>	Costing nothing.
<b>frivolous</b>	Not having any serious purpose or value. <i>Rules to stop <b>frivolous</b> lawsuits.</i>
<b>happy-go-lucky</b>	Presaging or likely to bring good luck.
<b>heedless</b>	Marked by or paying little heed or attention. <i><b>Heedless</b> of danger.</i>
<b>indifferent</b>	Showing no care or concern in attitude or action. <i>An <b>indifferent</b> chemical in a reaction.</i>
<b>lacking concern</b>	Inadequate in amount or degree.
<b>light-hearted</b>	Carefree and happy and lighthearted.
<b><u>nonchalant</u></b>	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>Drove his car with <b>nonchalant</b> abandon.</i>
<b>relaxed</b>	(of a muscle or other body part) not tense. <i>Make sure that your jaw is <b>relaxed</b>.</i>
<b><u>serene</u></b>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil. <i>He remained <b>serene</b> in the midst of turbulence.</i>
<b><u>unconcerned</u></b>	Not occupied or engaged with. <i>Readers <b>unconcerned</b> with style.</i>
<b>unruffled</b>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i><b>Unruffled</b> water.</i>
<b>untroubled</b>	Free from fear or doubt; easy in mind. <i>A man <b>untroubled</b> by a guilty conscience.</i>
