airy	Characterized by lightness and insubstantiality; as impalpable or intangible as air- Thomas Carlyle. <i>Airy gauze curtains.</i>
blasé	Nonchalantly unconcerned.
breezy	Pleasantly windy. <i>The text is written in a breezy matter of fact manner.</i>
calm	(of weather) free from storm or wind. <i>The city was reported to be calm but army patrols remained.</i>
carefree	Free of trouble and worry and care. <i>The carefree days of the holidays.</i>

casual	Without formality of style or manner, in particular (of clothing) suitable for everyday wear rather than formal occasions. <i>A difficult feat performed with casual mastery.</i>
composed	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>The performer seemed completely composed as she stepped onto the stage.</i>
easy	Obtained with little effort or sacrifice, often obtained illegally. <i>An easy job.</i>
equable	Not varying. <i>He could look sterner than his equable temperament would suggest.</i>
equanimous	In full control of your faculties.
free and easy	Unconstrained or not chemically bound in a molecule or not fixed and capable of relatively unrestricted motion.
free from care	Not taken up by scheduled activities.
free from worry	Costing nothing.
frivolous	Not having any serious purpose or value. <i>Rules to stop frivolous lawsuits.</i>
happy-go-lucky	Presaging or likely to bring good luck.
heedless	Marked by or paying little heed or attention. <i>Heedless of danger.</i>
indifferent	Showing no care or concern in attitude or action. <i>An indifferent chemical in a reaction.</i>
lacking concern	Inadequate in amount or degree.
light-hearted	Carefree and happy and lighthearted.
nonchalant	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>Drove his car with nonchalant abandon.</i>
relaxed	(of a muscle or other body part) not tense. <i>Make sure that your jaw is relaxed.</i>
serene	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil. <i>He remained serene in the midst of turbulence.</i>
unconcerned	Not occupied or engaged with. <i>Readers unconcerned with style.</i>
unruffled	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>Unruffled water.</i>
untroubled	Free from fear or doubt; easy in mind. <i>A man untroubled by a guilty conscience.</i>
