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## Associations of "Unsettling" (30 Words)

<b>attenuate</b>	Become weaker, in strength, value, or magnitude. <i>Her intolerance was <b>attenuated</b> by an unexpected liberalism.</i>
<b>balance</b>	Bring into balance or equilibrium. <i>The cost of obtaining such information needs to be <b>balanced</b> against its benefits.</i>
<b>counteract</b>	Oppose or check by a counteraction. <i>This will <b>counteract</b> the foolish actions of my colleagues.</i>
<a href="#"><b>counterbalance</b></a>	Contrast with equal weight or force. <i>The trolley used a <b>counterbalance</b> and leverage action to reduce the effort of lifting loads.</i>
<b>counterweight</b>	Constitute a counterweight or counterbalance to. <i>The scales have a series of <b>counterweights</b> that slide along a calibrated beam.</i>
<a href="#"><b>dampen</b></a>	Suppress or constrain so as to lessen in intensity. <i>Slider switches on the mixers can <b>dampen</b> the drums.</i>
<b>deaden</b>	Lessen the momentum or velocity of. <i>Laughter might <b>deaden</b> us to the moral issue.</i>
<b>debilitate</b>	Make weak. <i>He was severely <b>debilitated</b> by a stomach upset.</i>
<b>diatonic</b>	Of a melody or harmony constructed from a diatonic scale.
<b>dilute</b>	Lessen the strength or flavor of a solution or mixture. <i>A <b>dilute</b> solution of potassium permanganate.</i>
<b>dispassionate</b>	Not influenced by strong emotion, and so able to be rational and impartial. <i>A journalist should be a <b>dispassionate</b> reporter of fact.</i>
<b>embarrass</b>	Cause to be embarrassed cause to feel self conscious. <i>The state of the rivers will <b>embarrass</b> the enemy.</i>

<b>enervate</b>	Lacking in energy or vitality. <i>The <b>enervate</b> slightness of his frail form.</i>
<b>enfeeble</b>	Make weak or feeble. <i>The breakdown in law and order <b>enfeebled</b> the government's authority.</i>
<b>equilibrium</b>	Equality of distribution. <i>The task is the maintenance of social <b>equilibrium</b>.</i>
<b>equipoise</b>	Balance of forces or interests. <i>Capital flows act as an <b>equipoise</b> to international imbalances in savings.</i>
<a href="#"><u>equity</u></a>	Stocks and shares that carry no fixed interest. <i>People who have built up a significant amount of <b>equity</b> in their homes.</i>
<b>even</b>	Become even or more even. <i><b>Even</b> amounts of butter and sugar.</i>
<b>fatigued</b>	Drained of energy or effectiveness; extremely tired; completely exhausted.
<b>faze</b>	Disturb or disconcert (someone). <i>She was not <b>fazed</b> by his show of anger.</i>
<b>impartiality</b>	Equal treatment of all rivals or disputants; fairness. <i>Entries had to be submitted under a pseudonym to ensure <b>impartiality</b> in the judging process.</i>
<b>intimidate</b>	To compel or deter by or as if by threats. <i>Her boss <b>intimidates</b> her.</i>
<b>neutrality</b>	The condition of being chemically or electrically neutral. <i>During the war Switzerland maintained its <b>neutrality</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>offset</u></a>	Produce by offset printing. <i>These wheels have an <b>offset</b> of four inches.</i>
<b>steadiness</b>	The quality of being regular, even, and continuous in development, frequency, or intensity. <i>We got a glimpse of the <b>steadiness</b> and maturity we need to steer through this crisis.</i>
<a href="#"><u>symmetry</u></a>	Balance among the parts of something. <i>The overall <b>symmetry</b> makes the poem pleasant to the ear.</i>
<b>tonal</b>	Having tonality i.e. tones and chords organized in relation to one tone such as a keynote or tonic. <i>The poem's <b>tonal</b> lapses.</i>
<b>undermine</b>	Lessen the effectiveness, power, or ability of, especially gradually or insidiously. <i>The demolition engineers did eventually <b>undermine</b> two of the tower's six sides.</i>
