resolute Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering.

He was **resolute** in his fight to uphold liberal values.

staunch (of a wall) of strong or firm construction.

A **staunch** Catholic.

steadfast Firm and dependable especially in loyalty.

Steadfast loyalty.

Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable.

unfaltering
Her unfaltering energy and determination.

unflinching Not shrinking from danger.

He has shown **unflinching** determination throughout the campaign.

Going directly ahead from one point to another without veering or turning

unswerving aside.

A straight and narrow tree lined road **unswerving** across the lowlands.

Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss.

unwavering Unwavering loyalty.

invincible Too powerful to be defeated or overcome.

inviolable Never to be broken, infringed, or dishonoured. Fortifications that made the frontier inviolable.

invulnerable Immune to attack; impregnable.

No state in the region is now **invulnerable** to attack by another.

Not moving; stationary.

settled Established in a desired position or place; not moving about.

Nomads absorbed among the **settled** people.
