Synonyms of "Unshakeable" as an adjective (13 Words)

constant	(of a person) unchangingly faithful and dependable. <i>Maintained a constant</i> temperature.
decided	(of a quality) definite; unquestionable. You could never talk him round he was very decided .
determined	Determined or decided upon as by an authority. A determined effort to reduce inflation.
firm	Marked by firm determination or resolution not shakable. <i>A firm mattress.</i>



fixed	Of a number having a fixed and unchanging value. Living on fixed incomes.
ingrained	(used especially of ideas or principles) deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held. <i>Ingrained</i> habits of a lifetime.
<u>resolute</u>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>He was resolute in his fight to uphold liberal values.</i>
<u>staunch</u>	(of a wall) of strong or firm construction. A staunch Catholic.
steadfast	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. <i>Steadfast loyalty.</i>
unfaltering	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>Her unfaltering energy and determination.</i>
unflinching	Not shrinking from danger. <i>He has shown unflinching determination throughout the campaign.</i>
unswerving	Going directly ahead from one point to another without veering or turning aside. A straight and narrow tree lined road unswerving across the lowlands.
<u>unwavering</u>	Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss. Unwavering loyalty.

Usage Examples of "Unshakeable" as an adjective

- An unshakeable alibi.
- *My* unshakeable faith in the goodness of mankind.

Associations of "Unshakeable" (30 Words)

confirmed	Having been established or made firm or received the rite of confirmation. <i>A</i> confirmed teetotaller.
constant	A situation that does not change. The condition of struggle remained a constant .
decided	Recognizable; marked. You could never talk him round he was very decided .
determined	Having been learned or found or determined especially by investigation. Made continued and determined efforts to find and destroy enemy headquarters.



firm	Marked by firm determination or resolution not shakable. <i>He retains a firm belief in the efficacy of prayer.</i>
fixed	Having a fixed and unchanging value. A fixed resistor.
immobile	Not capable of movement or of being moved. <i>She sat immobile for a long time.</i>
<u>immovable</u>	Immovable property. The immovable hills.
immutable	Unchanging over time or unable to be changed. An immutable fact.
impregnable	Incapable of being overcome, challenged or refuted. <i>Impregnable</i> self confidence.
incontestable	Not open to question; obviously true.
indisputable	Impossible to doubt or dispute. <i>Indisputable</i> evidence of a witness.
<u>invincible</u>	Too powerful to be defeated or overcome. An invincible warrior.
inviolable	Never to be broken, infringed, or dishonoured. Fortifications that made the frontier inviolable .
invulnerable	Immune to attack; impregnable. No state in the region is now invulnerable to attack by another.
<u>motionless</u>	Not moving; stationary. An eagle hung almost motionless close to the ground.
<u>resolute</u>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. A resolute and unshakeable faith.
settled	Established in a desired position or place; not moving about. <i>Nomads absorbed among the settled people.</i>
<u>stability</u>	The quality or attribute of being firm and steadfast. There are fears for the political stability of the area.
<u>stable</u>	Shelter in a stable. A stable relationship.
standing	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. A standing army.
<u>static</u>	Relating to statics. An electro static generator produces high voltage static electricity.
<u>staunch</u>	Very loyal and committed in attitude. A staunch Catholic.



steadfast	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>Steadfast loyalty.</i>
<u>stiff</u>	In a stiff manner. She was scared stiff .
<u>unassailable</u>	Unable to be attacked, questioned, or defeated. An unassailable lead.
<u>unchangeable</u>	Not changeable or subject to change. One of the unchangeable facts of life.
unmoving	Not moving; still. Claudia sat unmoving behind her desk.
unswerving	Not changing or becoming weaker; steady or constant. <i>Unswerving loyalty</i> .
<u>unwavering</u>	Not wavering; steady or resolute. She fixed him with an unwavering stare.
