constant	(of a person) unchangingly faithful and dependable. <i>Maintained a constant temperature.</i>
decided	(of a quality) definite; unquestionable. <i>You could never talk him round he was very decided.</i>
determined	Determined or decided upon as by an authority. <i>A determined effort to reduce inflation.</i>
firm	Marked by firm determination or resolution not shakable. <i>A firm mattress.</i>

fixed	Of a number having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>Living on fixed incomes.</i>
ingrained	(used especially of ideas or principles) deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held. <i>Ingrained habits of a lifetime.</i>
resolute	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>He was resolute in his fight to uphold liberal values.</i>
staunch	(of a wall) of strong or firm construction. <i>A staunch Catholic.</i>
steadfast	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. <i>Steadfast loyalty.</i>
unfaltering	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>Her unfaltering energy and determination.</i>
unflinching	Not shrinking from danger. <i>He has shown unflinching determination throughout the campaign.</i>
unswerving	Going directly ahead from one point to another without veering or turning aside. <i>A straight and narrow tree lined road unswerving across the lowlands.</i>
unwavering	Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss. <i>Unwavering loyalty.</i>

confirmed	Having been established or made firm or received the rite of confirmation. <i>A confirmed teetotaller.</i>
constant	A situation that does not change. <i>The condition of struggle remained a constant.</i>
decided	Recognizable; marked. <i>You could never talk him round he was very decided.</i>
determined	Having been learned or found or determined especially by investigation. <i>Made continued and determined efforts to find and destroy enemy headquarters.</i>

firm	Marked by firm determination or resolution not shakable. <i>He retains a firm belief in the efficacy of prayer.</i>
fixed	Having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>A fixed resistor.</i>
immobile	Not capable of movement or of being moved. <i>She sat immobile for a long time.</i>
<u>immovable</u>	Immovable property. <i>The immovable hills.</i>
immutable	Unchanging over time or unable to be changed. <i>An immutable fact.</i>
impregnable	Incapable of being overcome, challenged or refuted. <i>Impregnable self confidence.</i>
incontestable	Not open to question; obviously true.
indisputable	Impossible to doubt or dispute. <i>Indisputable evidence of a witness.</i>
<u>invincible</u>	Too powerful to be defeated or overcome. <i>An invincible warrior.</i>
inviolable	Never to be broken, infringed, or dishonoured. <i>Fortifications that made the frontier inviolable.</i>
invulnerable	Immune to attack; impregnable. <i>No state in the region is now invulnerable to attack by another.</i>
<u>motionless</u>	Not moving; stationary. <i>An eagle hung almost motionless close to the ground.</i>
<u>resolute</u>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>A resolute and unshakeable faith.</i>
settled	Established in a desired position or place; not moving about. <i>Nomads absorbed among the settled people.</i>
<u>stability</u>	The quality or attribute of being firm and steadfast. <i>There are fears for the political stability of the area.</i>
<u>stable</u>	Shelter in a stable. <i>A stable relationship.</i>
standing	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>A standing army.</i>
<u>static</u>	Relating to statics. <i>An electrostatic generator produces high voltage static electricity.</i>
<u>staunch</u>	Very loyal and committed in attitude. <i>A staunch Catholic.</i>

steadfast	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>Steadfast</i> loyalty.
<u>stiff</u>	In a stiff manner. <i>She was scared stiff.</i>
<u>unassailable</u>	Unable to be attacked, questioned, or defeated. <i>An unassailable lead.</i>
<u>unchangeable</u>	Not changeable or subject to change. <i>One of the unchangeable facts of life.</i>
unmoving	Not moving; still. <i>Claudia sat unmoving behind her desk.</i>
unswerving	Not changing or becoming weaker; steady or constant. <i>Unswerving</i> loyalty.
<u>unwavering</u>	Not wavering; steady or resolute. <i>She fixed him with an unwavering stare.</i>
