inexpert Having or showing a lack of skill or knowledge.

unqualified Not meeting the proper standards and requirements and training.

I am singularly **unqualified** to write about football.

unschooled Lacking in schooling.

She was **unschooled** in the niceties of royal behaviour.

untaught Not acquired by teaching; natural or spontaneous.

By **untaught** instinct they know that scent means food.

untrained Not disciplined or conditioned or made adept by training.

Young minds **untrained** in the habit of concentration.

The **handling** of prisoners.

incapable Lacking capacity or ability.

Wilson blushed and was **incapable** of speech.

incompetent An incompetent person.

Incompetent witnesses.

inconsiderate Thoughtlessly causing hurt or inconvenience to others.

Shockingly **inconsiderate** behavior.

Lacking in power or forcefulness.

An **ineffective** administration.

ineligible Legally or officially unable to be considered for a position or benefit.

Ineligible for retirement benefits.

inept Revealing lack of perceptiveness or judgment or finesse.

If the rumor is true can anything be more **inept** than to repeat it now.

inexperienced Having little knowledge or experience of a particular thing.

An **inexperienced** driver.

laborer Someone who works with their hands; someone engaged in manual labor.

layman A non-ordained male member of a Church.

He was an active Catholic **layman**.

Inefficient or inept; clumsy.

maladroit Both men are unhappy about the **maladroit** way the matter has been

handled.

menial A person with a menial job.

Menial factory jobs.

neophyteA new convert being taught the principles of Christianity by a catechist.

A cast of **neophyte** actors.

novice A person new to and inexperienced in a job or situation.

He was a complete **novice** in foreign affairs.

Impaired in skill by neglect.

A rusty machine.

semiskilled Possessing or requiring limited skills.

A **semiskilled** job.

senile (of a condition) characteristic of or caused by old age.

Senile decay.

Lacking or showing a lack of what is fitting and considerate in dealing

tactless with others.

In the circumstances it was tactless to ask her age.



unpracticed Not having had extensive practice.

unprofessional Below or contrary to the standards expected in a particular profession. *A report on unprofessional conduct.*

Not limited or restricted. unqualified

A wife is usually considered **unqualified** to testify against her husband.

Poorly done. unskillful

It was an **unskillful** attempt.
