Synonyms of "Unsolved" as an adjective (22 Words)

arguable	Able to be argued or asserted. <i>A highly arguable assumption.</i>
<u>debatable</u>	Open to discussion or argument. <i>It is debatable whether the country is coming out of recession.</i>
disputed	Subject to disagreement and debate.
doubtful	Not known with certainty. <i>He looked doubtful but gave a nod.</i>
in a state of limbo	Currently fashionable.
in a state of uncertainty	Directed or bound inward.
in doubt	Currently fashionable.
in limbo	Currently fashionable.
inconclusive	Not conclusive; not putting an end to doubt or question. <i>Inconclusive evidence.</i>
indefinite	(of a word, inflection, or phrase) not determining the person, thing, time, etc. referred to. <i>Must you be so indefinite.</i>

moot

Having little or no practical relevance, typically because the subject is too uncertain to allow a decision.

*The whole matter is becoming increasingly **moot**.*

ongoing

Continuing; still in progress.

***Ongoing** negotiations.*

open

Open to or in view of all.

*An **open** letter to the editor.*

open to debate

Not having been filled.

pending

Awaiting decision or settlement.

*Business still **pending**.*

unanswered

Not returned in kind.

***Unanswered** letters.*

uncertain

Lacking or indicating lack of confidence or assurance.

*Everything is **uncertain** about the army.*

unconfirmed

Not finally established or settled.

*An **unconfirmed** report of shots being fired.*

undecided

Not yet having made a commitment.

*The jury remained **undecided**.*

undetermined

Not yet having been ascertained or determined.

*Of **undetermined** species.*

unresolved

Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved.

*Many problems remain **unresolved**.*

up in the air

Open.



Usage Examples of "Unsolved" as an adjective

Associations of "Unsolved" (30 Words)

abstruse	Difficult to understand; obscure. <i>An abstruse philosophical inquiry.</i>
abysmal	Very great; limitless. <i>Abysmal misery.</i>
baffle	Restrain the emission of (sound, fluid, etc). <i>An unexplained occurrence that baffled everyone.</i>
confound	Be confusing or perplexing to; cause to be unable to think clearly. <i>The rise in prices confounded expectations.</i>
<u>conundrum</u>	A confusing and difficult problem or question. <i>One of the most difficult conundrums for the experts.</i>
crossword	A puzzle consisting of a grid of squares and blanks into which words crossing vertically and horizontally are written according to clues. <i>She settled down to do the crossword.</i>
<u>cryptic</u>	Of an obscure nature. <i>He found his boss's utterances too cryptic.</i>
cryptogram	A text written in code.
<u>enigma</u>	Something that baffles understanding and cannot be explained. <i>Madeleine was still an enigma to him.</i>
esoterica	Secrets known only to an initiated minority. <i>A professor of such esoterica as angelology and comparative shamanism.</i>
factorize	Resolve (a polynomial) into factors. <i>All matrices can be factorized.</i>
incomprehensible	Difficult to understand- A. Einstein. <i>The most incomprehensible thing about the universe is that it is comprehensible.</i>
<u>insurmountable</u>	Impossible to surmount. <i>Insurmountable disadvantages.</i>
jigsaw	Fine-toothed power saw with a narrow blade; used to cut curved outlines. <i>Time is passed by doing jigsaws.</i>
<u>labyrinthine</u>	Resembling a labyrinth in form or complexity. <i>Labyrinthine streets and alleys.</i>
memento	A reminder of past events. <i>You can purchase a memento of your visit.</i>

<u>mystery</u>	A person or thing whose identity or nature is puzzling or unknown. <i>Much of her past is shrouded in mystery.</i>
pendent	Branched lighting fixture; often ornate; hangs from the ceiling. Pendent catkins.
preternatural	Surpassing the ordinary or normal. <i>Autumn had arrived with preternatural speed.</i>
problem	A thing that is difficult to achieve. <i>Practitioners help families develop strategies for managing problem behaviour in teens.</i>
<u>puzzle</u>	A jigsaw puzzle. <i>She was trying to puzzle out who the speakers were.</i>
rebus	A puzzle in which words are represented by combinations of pictures and individual letters; for instance, apex might be represented by a picture of an ape followed by a letter X.
riddle	Speak in riddles. Riddle me this then.
solve	Find the solution to (a problem or question) or understand the meaning of. Solve an old debt.
superhuman	Having or showing exceptional ability or powers. <i>The pilot made one last superhuman effort not to come down right on our heads.</i>
tantalize	Torment or tease (someone) with the sight or promise of something that is unobtainable. <i>She still tantalized him.</i>
<u>trivia</u>	Something of small importance. <i>We fill our days with meaningless trivia.</i>
<u>unfathomable</u>	(of water or a natural feature) impossible to measure the extent of. <i>Mountains of unfathomable scale.</i>
unresolved	Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved. <i>A number of issues remain unresolved.</i>
whodunit	A story about a crime (usually murder) presented as a novel or play or movie.
