## Synonyms of "Unsolved" as an adjective (22 Words)

<b>arguable</b>	Able to be argued or asserted. <i>A highly <b>arguable</b> assumption.</i>
<b><u>debatable</u></b>	Open to discussion or argument. <i>It is <b>debatable</b> whether the country is coming out of recession.</i>
<b>disputed</b>	Subject to disagreement and debate.
<b>doubtful</b>	Not known with certainty. <i>He looked <b>doubtful</b> but gave a nod.</i>
<b>in a state of limbo</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in a state of uncertainty</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>in doubt</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in limbo</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>inconclusive</b>	Not conclusive; not putting an end to doubt or question. <i><b>Inconclusive</b> evidence.</i>
<b>indefinite</b>	(of a word, inflection, or phrase) not determining the person, thing, time, etc. referred to. <i>Must you be so <b>indefinite</b>.</i>

<b><u>moot</u></b>	Having little or no practical relevance, typically because the subject is too uncertain to allow a decision. <i>The whole matter is becoming increasingly <b>moot</b>.</i>
<b><u>ongoing</u></b>	Continuing; still in progress. <i><b>Ongoing</b> negotiations.</i>
<b>open</b>	Open to or in view of all. <i>An <b>open</b> letter to the editor.</i>
<b>open to debate</b>	Not having been filled.
<b>pending</b>	Awaiting decision or settlement. <i>Business still <b>pending</b>.</i>
<b><u>unanswered</u></b>	Not returned in kind. <i><b>Unanswered</b> letters.</i>
<b><u>uncertain</u></b>	Lacking or indicating lack of confidence or assurance. <i>Everything is <b>uncertain</b> about the army.</i>
<b>unconfirmed</b>	Not finally established or settled. <i>An <b>unconfirmed</b> report of shots being fired.</i>
<b><u>undecided</u></b>	Not yet having made a commitment. <i>The jury remained <b>undecided</b>.</i>
<b>undetermined</b>	Not yet having been ascertained or determined. <i>Of <b>undetermined</b> species.</i>
<b>unresolved</b>	Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved. <i>Many problems remain <b>unresolved</b>.</i>
<b>up in the air</b>	Open.

## Associations of "Unsolved" (30 Words)

<b>abstruse</b>	Difficult to understand; obscure. <i>An <b>abstruse</b> philosophical inquiry.</i>
<b>abysmal</b>	Very great; limitless. <i><b>Abysmal</b> misery.</i>
<b>baffle</b>	Restrain the emission of (sound, fluid, etc). <i>An unexplained occurrence that <b>baffled</b> everyone.</i>
<b>confound</b>	Be confusing or perplexing to; cause to be unable to think clearly. <i>The rise in prices <b>confounded</b> expectations.</i>
<b><u>conundrum</u></b>	A confusing and difficult problem or question. <i>One of the most difficult <b>conundrums</b> for the experts.</i>
<b>crossword</b>	A puzzle consisting of a grid of squares and blanks into which words crossing vertically and horizontally are written according to clues. <i>She settled down to do the <b>crossword</b>.</i>
<b><u>cryptic</u></b>	Of an obscure nature. <i>He found his boss's utterances too <b>cryptic</b>.</i>
<b>cryptogram</b>	A text written in code.
<b><u>enigma</u></b>	Something that baffles understanding and cannot be explained. <i>Madeleine was still an <b>enigma</b> to him.</i>
<b>esoterica</b>	Secrets known only to an initiated minority. <i>A professor of such <b>esoterica</b> as angelology and comparative shamanism.</i>
<b>factorize</b>	Resolve (a polynomial) into factors. <i>All matrices can be <b>factorized</b>.</i>
<b>incomprehensible</b>	Difficult to understand- A. Einstein. <i>The most <b>incomprehensible</b> thing about the universe is that it is comprehensible.</i>
<b><u>insurmountable</u></b>	Impossible to surmount. <i><b>Insurmountable</b> disadvantages.</i>
<b>jigsaw</b>	Fine-toothed power saw with a narrow blade; used to cut curved outlines. <i>Time is passed by doing <b>jigsaws</b>.</i>
<b><u>labyrinthine</u></b>	Resembling a labyrinth in form or complexity. <i><b>Labyrinthine</b> streets and alleys.</i>
<b>memento</b>	A reminder of past events. <i>You can purchase a <b>memento</b> of your visit.</i>

<b><u>mystery</u></b>	A person or thing whose identity or nature is puzzling or unknown. <i>Much of her past is shrouded in <b>mystery</b>.</i>
<b>pendent</b>	Branched lighting fixture; often ornate; hangs from the ceiling. <b>Pendent</b> catkins.
<b>preternatural</b>	Surpassing the ordinary or normal. <i>Autumn had arrived with <b>preternatural</b> speed.</i>
<b>problem</b>	A thing that is difficult to achieve. <i>Practitioners help families develop strategies for managing <b>problem</b> behaviour in teens.</i>
<b><u>puzzle</u></b>	A jigsaw puzzle. <i>She was trying to <b>puzzle</b> out who the speakers were.</i>
<b>rebus</b>	A puzzle in which words are represented by combinations of pictures and individual letters; for instance, apex might be represented by a picture of an ape followed by a letter X.
<b>riddle</b>	Speak in riddles. <b>Riddle</b> me this then.
<b>solve</b>	Find the solution to (a problem or question) or understand the meaning of. <b>Solve</b> an old debt.
<b>superhuman</b>	Having or showing exceptional ability or powers. <i>The pilot made one last <b>superhuman</b> effort not to come down right on our heads.</i>
<b>tantalize</b>	Torment or tease (someone) with the sight or promise of something that is unobtainable. <i>She still <b>tantalized</b> him.</i>
<b><u>trivia</u></b>	Something of small importance. <i>We fill our days with meaningless <b>trivia</b>.</i>
<b><u>unfathomable</u></b>	(of water or a natural feature) impossible to measure the extent of. <i>Mountains of <b>unfathomable</b> scale.</i>
<b>unresolved</b>	Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved. <i>A number of issues remain <b>unresolved</b>.</i>
<b>whodunit</b>	A story about a crime (usually murder) presented as a novel or play or movie.
