open to debate Not having been filled.

pendingAwaiting decision or settlement.

Business still **pending**.

unanswered Not returned in kind.

Unanswered letters.

uncertain Lacking or indicating lack of confidence or assurance.

Everything is **uncertain** about the army.

unconfirmed Not finally established or settled.

An **unconfirmed** report of shots being fired.

undecided Not yet having made a commitment.

The jury remained **undecided**.

undetermined Not yet having been ascertained or determined.

Of **undetermined** species.

unresolved Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved.

Many problems remain unresolved.

up in the air Open.
