<u>abhorrent</u>

Inspiring disgust and loathing; repugnant. *An abhorrent deed*.



abominable	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. Abominable treatment of prisoners.
<u>appalling</u>	Very bad; awful. <i>Appalling</i> conditions.
<u>atrocious</u>	Shockingly brutal or cruel. <i>Atrocious</i> taste.
awful	(of a person) very unwell or troubled. I look awful in a swimsuit.
contemptible	Deserving of contempt or scorn. A display of contemptible cowardice.
deplorable	Deserving strong condemnation; completely unacceptable. Deplorable housing conditions in the inner city.
despicable	Deserving hatred and contempt. Would do something as despicable as murder.
<u>dire</u>	Of a very poor quality. There were dire warnings from the traffic organizations.
<u>dreadful</u>	(of a person) unwell or troubled. A dreadful storm.
execrable	Of very poor quality or condition. <i>Execrable</i> cheap wine.
fearful	Causing fear or dread or terror. A fearful howling.
frightful	Provoking horror. In a frightful hurry.
<u>ghastly</u>	Causing great horror or fear. A ghastly pallor.
<u>grim</u>	Very serious or gloomy. The grim aftermath of the bombing.
<u>gruesome</u>	Extremely unpleasant. <i>Gruesome</i> evidence of human sacrifice.
hateful	Evoking or deserving hatred. A hateful dress.
<u>heinous</u>	Extremely wicked, deeply criminal. <i>Heinous</i> accusations.
hideous	Extremely unpleasant. <i>Hideous</i> lizard like creatures.



<u>horrendous</u>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>Horrendous</i> explosions shook the city.
horrible	Very unpleasant. The tea tasted horrible .
horrific	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>Horrific</i> injuries.
<u>horrifying</u>	Provoking horror. A horrifying incident.
inconceivable	Totally unlikely. They behaved with inconceivable cruelty.
indefinable	Not capable of being precisely or readily described; not easily put into words. <i>She reminds me in some</i> indefinable way of my grandmother.
indescribable	Too unusual, extreme, or indefinite to be adequately described. <i>Indescribable beauty</i> .
indescribably bad	Defying expression or description.
indescribably evil	Defying expression or description.
indescribably wicked	Defying expression or description.
ineffable	Not to be uttered. The ineffable name of the Deity.
inexpressible	(of a feeling) too strong to be described or conveyed in words. A mood of inexpressible longing.
insufferable	Used of persons or their behavior. An insufferable bully.
loathsome	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. This loathsome little swine.
marvellous	Causing great wonder; extraordinary. <i>You have done a marvellous job.</i>
monstrous	Abnormally large. Twisted into monstrous shapes.
odious	Extremely unpleasant; repulsive. <i>Odious</i> hypocrisy.
<u>outrageous</u>	Shockingly bad or excessive. Subjected to outrageous cruelty.
<u>painful</u>	Causing physical discomfort. A painful performance.



repellent	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. The idea of eating meat is repellent to me.
repugnant	Extremely distasteful; unacceptable. A by law must not be repugnant to the general law of the country.
repulsive	Possessing the ability to repel. The most repulsive character in recent novels.
<u>revolting</u>	Causing intense disgust; disgusting. There was a revolting smell that lingered in the air.
<u>shocking</u>	Causing a feeling of surprise and dismay. <i>Shocking</i> behaviour.
<u>sickening</u>	Causing or able to cause nausea. A sickening stench.
terrible	Causing or likely to cause terror; sinister. A terrible crime.
unimaginable	Difficult or impossible to imagine or comprehend. Lives of almost unimaginable deprivation.
unnameable	Too sacred to be uttered. His mind was blank with an unnameable fear.
untellable	Defying expression or description. A thing of untellable splendor.
<u>unthinkable</u>	(of a situation or event) too unlikely or undesirable to be considered a possibility. <i>It was unthinkable that John could be dead.</i>
unutterable	Too sacred to be uttered. Unutterable consonant clusters.
vile	Causing or able to cause nausea. <i>As vile a rogue as ever lived</i> .
wonderful	Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. <i>They all think she s wonderful.</i>

<u>horrifying</u>	Causing horror; extremely shocking. A horrifying incident.
<u>indescribable</u>	Too unusual, extreme, or indefinite to be adequately described. <i>Most prisoners suffered</i> indescribable <i>hardship</i> .
ineffable	Not to be uttered. The ineffable Hebrew name that gentiles write as Jehovah.
inexpressible	Defying expression. A mood of inexpressible longing.
inscrutable	Impossible to understand or interpret. The inscrutable workings of Providence.
<u>nasty</u>	Behaving in an unpleasant or spiteful way. In a nasty mood.
terrible	Extreme in degree or extent or amount or impact. <i>The weather was terrible</i> .
<u>terribly</u>	Very badly or unpleasantly. It was all terribly frustrating.
<u>terrifying</u>	Causing extreme fear. The terrifying events of the past few weeks.
<u>tragedy</u>	An event causing great suffering, destruction, and distress, such as a serious accident, crime, or natural catastrophe. <i>Greek tragedy</i> .
uncommunicative	Unwilling to talk or impart information. <i>He had always been quiet and uncommunicative having few friends.</i>
unutterable	Too great or awful to describe. Unutterable consonant clusters.
