Extremely wicked, deeply criminal.

Heinous accusations.

Extremely unpleasant.

hideous

Hideous lizard like creatures.

revolting Causing intense disgust; disgusting.

shocking Causing a feeling of surprise and dismay.

Shocking behaviour.

Sickening Causing or able to cause nausea.

terrible Causing or likely to cause terror; sinister.

A terrible crime.

unimaginable Difficult or impossible to imagine or comprehend.

Lives of almost unimaginable deprivation.

unnameable Too sacred to be uttered.

untellable Defying expression or description.

A thing of **untellable** splendor.

(of a situation or event) too unlikely or undesirable to be
