Synonyms of "Unspoken" as an adjective (16 Words)

| mute | Expressed without speech- Emily Dickinson- Thomas Wolfe. <i>She gazed at him in mute appeal.</i> |
| silent | Failing to speak or communicate etc when expected to. <i>A silent dog whistle.</i> |
| tongueless | Expressed without speech- Emily Dickinson- Thomas Wolfe. <i>Best grief is tongueless.</i> |
| unarticulated | Not consisting of segments that are held together by joints. <i>Previously unarticulated anger.</i> |

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| unavowed | Not openly expressed. <i>An underlying unavowed hostility.</i> |
| undeclared | Not publicly announced, admitted, or acknowledged. <i>Fighting an undeclared war.</i> |
| unexpressed | (of a thought or feeling) not communicated or made known. <i>He thought it best to leave his doubts unexpressed.</i> |
| unmentioned | Not mentioned. <i>A monument unmentioned in all the architectural guides.</i> |
| unsaid | Not made explicit. <i>Things left unsaid.</i> |
| unstated | Not made explicit. <i>His action is clear but his reason remains unstated.</i> |
| unuttered | (of words or thoughts) not spoken or expressed. <i>Her lips mouthed unuttered thanks.</i> |
| unverbalised | Not made explicit. |
| unverbalized | Not made explicit. |
| unvoiced | Produced without vibration of the vocal cords. <i>Unvoiced consonants such as p and k and s.</i> |
| voiceless | Produced without vibration of the vocal cords. <i>Millions of Americans feel voiceless and powerless to bring positive change to the political system.</i> |
| wordless | (of a play, book, or other work) without words or speech. <i>Choking exasperation and wordless shame.</i> |
