Not consisting of segments that are held together by joints. unarticulated

Previously **unarticulated** anger.



unavowed Not openly expressed.

An underlying **unavowed** hostility.

undeclared Not publicly announced, admitted, or acknowledged.

Fighting an **undeclared** war.

unexpressed (of a thought or feeling) not communicated or made known.

He thought it best to leave his doubts **unexpressed**.

unmentioned Not mentioned.

A monument **unmentioned** in all the architectural guides.

unsaid Not made explicit.

Things left **unsaid**.

unstated Not made explicit.

His action is clear but his reason remains **unstated**.

unuttered (of words or thoughts) not spoken or expressed.

Her lips mouthed **unuttered** thanks.

unverbalised Not made explicit.unverbalized Not made explicit.

unvoiced Produced without vibration of the vocal cords.

Unvoiced consonants such as p and k and s.

Produced without vibration of the vocal cords.

voiceless Millions of Americans feel **voiceless** and powerless to bring positive

change to the political system.

wordless (of a play, book, or other work) without words or speech.

Choking exasperation and wordless shame.
