Synonyms of "Unstoppable" as an adjective (22 Words)

constant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. Maintained a constant temperature.
<u>continual</u>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>The continual banging of the shutters.</i>
continuing	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. The act provided a continuing annual appropriation.
continuous	Of a function or curve; extending without break or irregularity. The whole performance is enacted in one continuous movement.
endless	Having or seeming to have no end or limit. <i>Time is endless</i> .



incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The</i> incessant <i>beat of the music.</i>
interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically. <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
<u>lasting</u>	Lasting a long time without change. A lasting relationship.
never-ending	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
perpetual	Denoting or having a position, job, or trophy held for life. <i>Hell s perpetual fires.</i>
persistent	Continually recurring to the mind. An attempt to stop persistent drink drivers.
<u>steady</u>	(of a person) sensible, reliable, and self-restrained. <i>Held the ladder steady</i> .
sustained	(of an electric arc) continuous. Several years of sustained economic growth.
<u>unabated</u>	Continuing at full strength or intensity. The popularity of his books among young people continued unabated .
unabating	Not weakening or losing intensity. The battle raged with unabating fury.
<u>unbroken</u>	Not broken; whole and intact; in one piece. Unbroken colts.
unceasing	Continuing forever or indefinitely. The unceasing efforts of the staff.
<u>unending</u>	Having or seeming to have no end. <i>The charity rescues children from unending poverty.</i>
uninterrupted	Having undisturbed continuity. Moving midweek holidays to the nearest Monday or Friday allows uninterrupted work weeks.
<u>unrelenting</u>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>Unrelenting</i> opponents.
unrelieved	Lacking variation or change; monotonous. Unrelieved suffering.
<u>unremitting</u>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Unremitting drizzle</i> .
