Synonyms of "Unstoppable" as an adjective (22 Words)

constant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Maintained a constant temperature.</i>
<u>continual</u>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>The continual banging of the shutters.</i>
continuing	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>The act provided a continuing annual appropriation.</i>
continuous	Of a function or curve; extending without break or irregularity. <i>The whole performance is enacted in one continuous movement.</i>
endless	Having or seeming to have no end or limit. <i>Time is endless.</i>

incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
lasting	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A lasting relationship.</i>
never-ending	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
perpetual	Denoting or having a position, job, or trophy held for life. <i>Hell's perpetual fires.</i>
persistent	Continually recurring to the mind. <i>An attempt to stop persistent drink drivers.</i>
steady	(of a person) sensible, reliable, and self-restrained. <i>Held the ladder steady.</i>
sustained	(of an electric arc) continuous. <i>Several years of sustained economic growth.</i>
unabated	Continuing at full strength or intensity. <i>The popularity of his books among young people continued unabated.</i>
unabating	Not weakening or losing intensity. <i>The battle raged with unabating fury.</i>
unbroken	Not broken; whole and intact; in one piece. <i>Unbroken colts.</i>
unceasing	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
unending	Having or seeming to have no end. <i>The charity rescues children from unending poverty.</i>
uninterrupted	Having undisturbed continuity. <i>Moving midweek holidays to the nearest Monday or Friday allows uninterrupted work weeks.</i>
unrelenting	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>Unrelenting opponents.</i>
unrelieved	Lacking variation or change; monotonous. <i>Unrelieved suffering.</i>
unremitting	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Unremitting drizzle.</i>
