Synonyms of "Unstoppable" as an adjective (22 Words)

constant Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.

Maintained a **constant** temperature.

Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably

with continuous meaning without interruption.

The **continual** banging of the shutters.

continuingWithout a break in continuity; ongoing.

The act provided a **continuing** annual appropriation.

continuous Of a function or curve; extending without break or irregularity.

The whole performance is enacted in one **continuous** movement.

endless Having or seeming to have no end or limit.

Time is **endless**.



incessant Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.

The **incessant** beat of the music.

interminable Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically.

An interminable sermon.

Lasting Lasting a long time without change.

A **lasting** relationship.

never-ending Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.

perpetual Denoting or having a position, job, or trophy held for life.

Hell s **perpetual** fires.

persistent Continually recurring to the mind.

An attempt to stop **persistent** drink drivers.

steady (of a person) sensible, reliable, and self-restrained.

Held the ladder **steady**.

sustained (of an electric arc) continuous.

Several years of **sustained** economic growth.

unabated Continuing at full strength or intensity.

The popularity of his books among young people continued **unabated**.

unbroken Not broken; whole and intact; in one piece.

Unbroken colts.

unceasing Continuing forever or indefinitely.

The **unceasing** efforts of the staff.

unending Having or seeming to have no end.

The charity rescues children from **unending** poverty.

Having undisturbed continuity.

uninterrupted Moving midweek holidays to the nearest Monday or Friday allows

uninterrupted work weeks.

Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty.

Unrelenting opponents.

unrelieved Lacking variation or change; monotonous.

Unrelieved suffering.

unremitting Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.

Unremitting drizzle.
