## Synonyms of "Unstoppable" as an adjective (22 Words)

<b>constant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Maintained a <b>constant</b> temperature.</i>
<b><u>continual</u></b>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i>The <b>continual</b> banging of the shutters.</i>
<b>continuing</b>	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>The act provided a <b>continuing</b> annual appropriation.</i>
<b>continuous</b>	Of a function or curve; extending without break or irregularity. <i>The whole performance is enacted in one <b>continuous</b> movement.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Having or seeming to have no end or limit. <i>Time is <b>endless</b>.</i>

<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>An <b>interminable</b> sermon.</i>
<b>lasting</b>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A <b>lasting</b> relationship.</i>
<b>never-ending</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
<b>perpetual</b>	Denoting or having a position, job, or trophy held for life. <i>Hell's <b>perpetual</b> fires.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Continually recurring to the mind. <i>An attempt to stop <b>persistent</b> drink drivers.</i>
<b>steady</b>	(of a person) sensible, reliable, and self-restrained. <i>Held the ladder <b>steady</b>.</i>
<b>sustained</b>	(of an electric arc) continuous. <i>Several years of <b>sustained</b> economic growth.</i>
<b>unabated</b>	Continuing at full strength or intensity. <i>The popularity of his books among young people continued <b>unabated</b>.</i>
<b>unabating</b>	Not weakening or losing intensity. <i>The battle raged with <b>unabating</b> fury.</i>
<b>unbroken</b>	Not broken; whole and intact; in one piece. <i><b>Unbroken</b> colts.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
<b>unending</b>	Having or seeming to have no end. <i>The charity rescues children from <b>unending</b> poverty.</i>
<b>uninterrupted</b>	Having undisturbed continuity. <i>Moving midweek holidays to the nearest Monday or Friday allows <b>uninterrupted</b> work weeks.</i>
<b>unrelenting</b>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i><b>Unrelenting</b> opponents.</i>
<b>unrelieved</b>	Lacking variation or change; monotonous. <i><b>Unrelieved</b> suffering.</i>
<b>unremitting</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i><b>Unremitting</b> drizzle.</i>
