infelicitous Marked by or producing unhappiness.

inopportune Occurring at an inconvenient or inappropriate time.

A storm blew up at an **inopportune** moment.

malapropos

Of an inappropriate or incorrectly applied nature.

These terms applied to him seem to me **malapropos**.

out of character Directed outward or serving to direct something outward.

out of keeping No longer fashionable.

out of place Out of power; especially having been unsuccessful in an election.

Not in keeping with accepted standards of what is right or proper in

unbecoming polite society.

An unbecoming striped sundress.

unbefitting Not befitting.

Unbefitting conduct.

undesirable Not wanted or desirable because harmful, objectionable, or unpleasant.

Undesirable impurities in steel.

Not appropriate or proper (or even legal) in the circumstances.

I didn t want to show **undue** excitement.

unfitting

Not in keeping with what is correct or proper.

Certain occupations were held **unfitting** for baptized believers.

(of behaviour or actions) not proper or appropriate.

unseemly

An unseemly analysis with his

An **unseemly** squabble.

unsuited Not right or appropriate.

He was totally **unsuited** for the job.

Usage Examples of "Unsuitable" as an adjective

- The display is unsuitable for young children.
- The movie is unsuitable for children.

something. <u>incongruous</u>

A plan **incongruous** with reason.

Not suitable or desirable, especially as a marriage partner. ineligible

Ineligible for retirement benefits.

Characterized by iniquity; wicked because it is believed to be a sin. iniquitous

These awards remain an **iniquitous** system.

Having no bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. irrelevant

An **irrelevant** comment.

Mismanagement, especially culpable neglect of duties. misconduct

The general was pardoned for **misconduct** of the war.

Lead someone in the wrong direction or give someone wrong directions. misdirect

Voters were **misdirect**ed to the wrong polling station.

Interpret in the wrong way. misinterpret

Don t **misinterpret** my comments as criticism.



misplace Put (an object) in the wrong place and so lose it temporarily.
