- Lacking self-confidence.
- Lacking or indicating lack of confidence or assurance.
- (of a fact) not fixed or certain.





Synonyms of "Unsure" as an adjective (29 Words)

uncertain or unable to decide about what course to follow.

Was ambivalent about having children.

diffident Modest or shy because of a lack of self-confidence.

Stood in the doorway diffident and abashed.

distrustfulFeeling or showing distrust of someone or something.

A man of **distrustful** nature.

doubtful Improbable.

Of **doubtful** legality.

dubious Not to be relied upon; suspect.

I was rather **dubious** about the whole idea.

in a dilemma Directed or bound inward.

in a quandary Holding office.

in two minds Directed or bound inward.



incertain Lacking or indicating lack of confidence or assurance.

(of a shoot) not having all the axes terminating in a flower bud

indeterminate and so potentially of indefinite length.

A zillion is a large **indeterminate** number.

Showing or feeling hesitancy; uncertain. irresolute She stood **irresolute** outside his door.

lacking assurance Nonexistent.

lacking confidence Inadequate in amount or degree. **lacking self-confidence** Inadequate in amount or degree.

Lacking in trust; suspicious. mistrustful

He wondered if he had been unduly **mistrustful** of her.

not confident Having or marked by confidence or assurance.

not fixed Having a fixed and unchanging value.

not settled Established in a desired position or place; not moving about.

Marked by or given to doubt. sceptical

The public were deeply **sceptical** about some of the proposals.

Having a dislike of or aversion to a specified thing.

shy A shy smile.

Not as expected. **suspicious**

She gave him a **suspicious** look.

Lacking self-confidence. timid

I was too **timid** to ask for what I wanted.

Inclined to timidity or lack of self-confidence. unassertive His bland and **unassertive** personal style.

Not able to be relied on; not known or definite. uncertain

An **uncertain** recollection of events.

Not confident: hesitant. unconfident

Very young people may have an **unconfident** approach.

Lacking conviction. unconvinced

I remain **unconvinced**.

Characterized by indecision. undecided

The jury remained **undecided**.


Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. unknown

Things obscurely felt surged up from **unknown** depths.

Not precisely limited, determined, or distinguished.

vague Vague feelings of sadness.
