**baseless** Without foundation in fact.

**Baseless** allegations.

defective Not working properly.

Dystrophin is commonly **defective** in muscle tissue.

faulty Having a defect.

A **faulty** brake.

flawed (of a person) having a weakness in character.

A fatally **flawed** strategy.

flimsy Not convincing.

The **flimsy** garment fell from her.



groundless Without a basis in reason or fact.

The allegations proved **groundless**.

illogical Lacking orderly continuity.

An **illogical** fear of the supernatural.

(of an argument or statement) not seeming reasonable or probable; failing

**implausible** to convince.

Gave the teacher an **implausible** excuse.

inadmissible (especially of evidence in court) not accepted as valid.

He held that such evidence was **inadmissible**.

indefensible Not able to be protected against attack.

This behaviour is morally **indefensible**.

**insupportable** Unable to be supported or justified.

He had arrived at a wholly **insupportable** conclusion.

invalid Having no cogency or legal force.

**Invalid** reasoning.

Of a number quantity or expression not expressible as a ratio of two integers and having an infinite and non recurring expansion when

<u>irrational</u> expressed as a decimal Examples of irrational numbers are the number and

the square root of 2.

Irrational numbers.

**preposterous**So unreasonable as to invite derision.

A **preposterous** suggestion.

**refutable** Able to be refuted.

senseless Lacking sense or understanding or judgment.

A **senseless** act.

Shaky

Not safe or reliable; liable to fail or falter.

After a **shaky** start the Scottish team made superb efforts.

**specious**Based on pretense; deceptively pleasing.

A **specious** claim.

unacceptable Not satisfactory or allowable.

An **unacceptable** violation of personal freedom.

**unarguable** Against which no argument can be made.

Unarguable proof of conspiracy.

undefendable Not defended or capable of being defended.

His views are undefendable.

**unfounded** Without a basis in reason or fact.

Her fear that she had cancer was **unfounded**.



weak

unjustifiable Incapable of being justified or explained.

An **unjustifiable** restriction on their freedom.

unjustified Not shown to be right or reasonable.

**Unjustified** price increases.

Physically unsound or diseased.

Dorinda was mentally **unsound**.

unwarrantedUnwarranted limitations of personal freedom.

Relating to or denoting the weakest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts only at distances less than about 10 cm is very much weaker than the electromagnetic and the strong interactions and conserves

neither strangeness parity nor isospin.

Their problems arose from fielding **weak** teams in league matches.
