<u>reputable</u>	Having a good reputation. A <b>reputable</b> business.
<u>righteous</u>	Morally right or justifiable. He is <b>righteous</b> trash.
saintly	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>A truly saintly woman.</i>
stainless	Unmarked by or resistant to stains or discoloration. <i>Her supposedly <b>stainless</b> past.</i>
unstained	Free from blemishes. An apron keeps his clothing <b>unstained</b> .
unsullied	(of reputation) free from blemishes. <i>His <b>unsullied</b> name.</i>
untarnished	(of metal or metalware) not having lost its lustre. An <b>untarnished</b> reputation.
upright	Upright in position or posture. An <b>upright</b> member of the community.
upstanding	Meriting respect or esteem. <b>Upstanding</b> feathered plumes.



<u>virtuous</u>	Chaste (typically used of a woman). She considered herself very <b>virtuous</b> because she neither drank nor smoked.
wholesome	Conducive to or suggestive of good health and physical well-being. Good <b>wholesome</b> fun.

lave	Cleanse (one's body) with soap and water. <i>The waves laved the shore.</i>



neatly	In a neat way. She <b>neatly</b> sidestepped the question.
<u>pristine</u>	In its original condition; unspoilt. Handed her his <b>pristine</b> white handkerchief.
<u>pure</u>	Being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. It was revenge <b>pure</b> and simple.
<u>purity</u>	Freedom from immorality, especially of a sexual nature. White roses represent <b>purity</b> and innocence.
shipshape	In good order; trim and neat. <i>He checked that everything was <b>shipshape</b></i> .
<u>spotless</u>	Absolutely clean or pure; immaculate. A <b>spotless</b> white apron.
<u>tidy</u>	An act or spell of tidying something. A cable <b>tidy</b> .
<u>unaffected</u>	Undergoing no change when acted upon. An <b>unaffected</b> grace.
