<b><u>pious</u></b>	Dutiful or loyal, especially towards one's parents. <i><b>Pious</b> readings.</i>
<b><u>reputable</u></b>	Having a good reputation. <i>A <b>reputable</b> business.</i>
<b><u>righteous</u></b>	Morally right or justifiable. <i>He is <b>righteous</b> trash.</i>
<b>saintly</b>	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>A truly <b>saintly</b> woman.</i>
<b>stainless</b>	Unmarked by or resistant to stains or discoloration. <i>Her supposedly <b>stainless</b> past.</i>
<b>unstained</b>	Free from blemishes. <i>An apron keeps his clothing <b>unstained</b>.</i>
<b>unsullied</b>	(of reputation) free from blemishes. <i>His <b>unsullied</b> name.</i>
<b>untarnished</b>	(of metal or metalware) not having lost its lustre. <i>An <b>untarnished</b> reputation.</i>
<b>upright</b>	Upright in position or posture. <i>An <b>upright</b> member of the community.</i>
<b>upstanding</b>	Meriting respect or esteem. <i><b>Upstanding</b> feathered plumes.</i>

<b>virtuous</b>	Chaste (typically used of a woman). <i>She considered herself very <b>virtuous</b> because she neither drank nor smoked.</i>
<b>wholesome</b>	Conducive to or suggestive of good health and physical well-being. <i>Good <b>wholesome</b> fun.</i>

<b>lave</b>	Cleanse (one's body) with soap and water. <i>The waves <b>laved</b> the shore.</i>

<b>neatly</b>	In a neat way. <i>She <b>neatly</b> sidestepped the question.</i>
<b><u>pristine</u></b>	In its original condition; unspoilt. <i>Handed her his <b>pristine</b> white handkerchief.</i>
<b><u>pure</u></b>	Being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>It was revenge <b>pure</b> and simple.</i>
<b><u>purity</u></b>	Freedom from immorality, especially of a sexual nature. <i>White roses represent <b>purity</b> and innocence.</i>
<b>shipshape</b>	In good order; trim and neat. <i>He checked that everything was <b>shipshape</b>.</i>
