moral	Concerned with the principles of right and wrong behaviour. <i>The moral dimensions of medical intervention.</i>
<u>pious</u>	Dutiful or loyal, especially towards one's parents. <i>Pious readings.</i>
<u>reputable</u>	Having a good reputation. <i>A reputable business.</i>
<u>righteous</u>	Morally right or justifiable. <i>He is righteous trash.</i>
saintly	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>A truly saintly woman.</i>
stainless	Unmarked by or resistant to stains or discoloration. <i>Her supposedly stainless past.</i>
unstained	Free from blemishes. <i>An apron keeps his clothing unstained.</i>
unsullied	(of reputation) free from blemishes. <i>His unsullied name.</i>
untarnished	(of metal or metalware) not having lost its lustre. <i>An untarnished reputation.</i>
upright	Upright in position or posture. <i>An upright member of the community.</i>
upstanding	Meriting respect or esteem. <i>Upstanding feathered plumes.</i>

virtuous

Chaste (typically used of a woman).

*She considered herself very **virtuous** because she neither drank nor smoked.*

wholesome

Conducive to or suggestive of good health and physical well-being.

*Good **wholesome** fun.*

In accordance with the highest standards; faultless.

*He had **impeccable** manners.*

innocent

Free from evil or guilt.

*An **innocent** mistake.*

launder

Cleanse with a cleaning agent, such as soap, and water.

*We began to notice attempts to **launder** the data retrospectively.*

lave

Cleanse (one's body) with soap and water.

*The waves **laved** the shore.*

neatly	In a neat way. <i>She neatly sidestepped the question.</i>
<u>pristine</u>	In its original condition; unspoilt. <i>Handed her his pristine white handkerchief.</i>
<u>pure</u>	Being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>It was revenge pure and simple.</i>
<u>purity</u>	Freedom from immorality, especially of a sexual nature. <i>White roses represent purity and innocence.</i>
shipshape	In good order; trim and neat. <i>He checked that everything was shipshape.</i>
<u>spotless</u>	Absolutely clean or pure; immaculate. <i>A spotless white apron.</i>
<u>tidy</u>	An act or spell of tidying something. <i>A cable tidy.</i>
<u>unaffected</u>	Undergoing no change when acted upon. <i>An unaffected grace.</i>
unblemished	Free from physical or moral spots or stains. <i>An unblemished complexion.</i>
uncontaminated	Not corrupted by contact or association. <i>Uncontaminated air and food.</i>
unmixed	Not mixed with extraneous elements. <i>Not an unmixed blessing.</i>
unpainted	Not having a coat of paint or badly in need of a fresh coat. <i>Unpainted furniture.</i>
unpolluted	Not contaminated with noxious or poisonous substances. <i>Her mind remains unpolluted by the filth they teach her.</i>
unspotted	Without soil or spot or stain. <i>The network of avian enthusiasts ensures that no rarity goes unspotted.</i>
unstained	Not having a coating of stain or varnish. <i>His unstained jeans.</i>
unsullied	Free from blemishes. <i>An unsullied reputation.</i>
