Synonyms of "Untapped" as an adjective (4 Words)

<u>dormant</u>	(of a disease) causing no symptoms but not cured and liable to recur. The disease may remain dormant and undetected until transmitted to other fish.
inactive	Lacking activity; lying idle or unused. <i>The inactive X chromosome.</i>
quiescent	In a state or period of inactivity or dormancy. The quiescent melancholy of the town.
<u>unused</u>	Not familiar with or accustomed to. Unused to spicy food she took a long mouthful of water.

hitherto	Until now or until the point in time under discussion. Hitherto part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.
hypostasis	The single person of Christ, as contrasted with his dual human and divine nature.
<u>indigenous</u>	Originating where it is found. Coriander is indigenous to southern Europe.
inhabitant	A person or animal that lives in or occupies a place.
inherited	Occurring among members of a family usually by heredity. An inherited disease.
innate	Being talented through inherited qualities. <i>Her innate capacity for organization.</i>
interaction	Communication or direct involvement with someone or something. <i>He built tools to analyse user interactions on social networks.</i>



interactive	Capable of acting on or influencing each other. Fully sighted children in interactive play with others with defective vision.
<u>nascent</u>	Being born or beginning. <i>The nascent chicks.</i>
natal	A port city in northeastern Brazil. <i>He was living in the south many miles from his natal city.</i>
<u>native</u>	Used in names of animals or plants resembling others familiar elsewhere e g native bee. <i>Native</i> Americans.
natural	Relating to earthly human or physical nature as distinct from the spiritual or supernatural realm. Our natural environment.
nature	The basic or inherent features, character, or qualities of something. <i>The true nature of jealousy.</i>
outdoors	Outside a building. <i>He wanted to get outdoors a little.</i>
pollinate	Convey pollen to or deposit pollen on (a stigma, ovule, flower, or plant) and so allow fertilization. There are not enough bees to pollinate their crops.
pollination	Transfer of pollen from the anther to the stigma of a plant. Crop pollination is essential to fruit production.
pollinator	An insect that carries pollen from one flower to another. Bees are effective pollinator s of fruit and vegetables.
resource	Provide with resources. A man of resource .
<u>root</u>	Take root and begin to grow. The root form of the word.
<u>scene</u>	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i>He made a scene</i> .
source	Obtain from a particular source. Each type of coffee is source d from one country.
tribal	Members of tribal communities especially in South Asia. People don t want political parties stuck in rigid tribal boundaries.
wavelet	A small wave of water; a ripple.
<u>wilderness</u>	A bewildering profusion. A wilderness of masts in the harbor.
