<u>resolute</u>	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>Faced with a resolute opposition.</i>
resolved	Firmly determined to do something. <i>Mysteries solved and unsolved problems resolved and unresolved.</i>
steadfast	Resolutely or dutifully firm and unwavering. <i>Steadfast loyalty.</i>
<u>steady</u>	Not subject to change or variation especially in behavior. <i>Steady nerves.</i>
<u>stiff</u>	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>She was scared stiff.</i>
sustained	Maintained at length without interruption or weakening. <i>Sustained flight.</i>
<u>tireless</u>	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. <i>A tireless worker.</i>
unbendable	Not able to be changed or adapted. <i>Obeying his commands with unbendable allegiance.</i>
<u>unfaltering</u>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>Her unfaltering energy and determination.</i>
unflagging	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>Unflagging courtesy.</i>
unfluctuating	Not liable to fluctuate or especially to fall.
unhesitating	Characterized by quickness and firmness. <i>Unequivocal and unhesitating condemnation.</i>
<u>unrelenting</u>	Not yielding in strength, severity, or determination. <i>Unrelenting opponents.</i>

unremitting	Never relaxing or slackening; incessant. <i>Unremitting drizzle.</i>
unshakable	Without flaws or loopholes.
unshakeable	Without flaws or loopholes. <i>My unshakeable faith in the goodness of mankind.</i>
unswerving	Going directly ahead from one point to another without veering or turning aside. <i>Unswerving allegiance.</i>
untiring	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. <i>His untiring efforts in commissioning ecological reports.</i>
unyielding	Stubbornly unyielding. <i>An unyielding head support.</i>

intransigent	An intransigent person. <i>An intransigent conservative opposed to every liberal tendency.</i>
invariable	Never changing. <i>His routine was invariable.</i>
persistent	Stubbornly unyielding- T.S.Eliot. <i>Persistent leaves remain attached past maturity.</i>
relentless	Harsh or inflexible. <i>The relentless heat of the desert.</i>
resolute	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>He was resolute in his fight to uphold liberal values.</i>
solid	A substance or object that is solid rather than liquid or fluid. <i>Solid color.</i>
stable	Shelter in a stable. <i>The economy is stable.</i>
staunch	Very loyal and committed in attitude. <i>Staunch the blood flow.</i>
steadfast	Resolutely or dutifully firm and unwavering. <i>A steadfast ally.</i>
steady	Make or become steady. <i>A solid steady young man.</i>
stiff	In a stiff manner. <i>Ordinary working stiffs in respectable offices.</i>
stubborn	Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. <i>Two stubborn young people intent on doing their own thing.</i>
tenacious	Sticking together. <i>A mind not gifted to discover truth but tenacious to hold it.</i>
unbending	Reserved, formal, or strict in one's behaviour or attitudes; austere and inflexible. <i>His output is prodigious and springs from the unbending control he exercises over every aspect of his life.</i>

- undeterred** Not deterred.
*Pursued his own path **undeterred** by lack of popular appreciation and understanding.*
- unrelenting** Harsh.

- unshaken** Unshaken in purpose.
*Their trust in him remained **unshaken**.*
- unswerving** Firm and dependable especially in loyalty.
