<b>relentless</b>	Never-ceasing. <i>A patient but <b>relentless</b> taskmaster.</i>
<b>resolute</b>	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>Faced with a <b>resolute</b> opposition.</i>
<b>resolved</b>	Firmly determined to do something. <i>Mysteries solved and unsolved problems <b>resolved</b> and <b>unresolved</b>.</i>
<b>steadfast</b>	Resolutely or dutifully firm and unwavering. <i><b>Steadfast</b> loyalty.</i>
<b>steady</b>	Not subject to change or variation especially in behavior. <i><b>Steady</b> nerves.</i>
<b>stiff</b>	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>She was scared <b>stiff</b>.</i>
<b>sustained</b>	Maintained at length without interruption or weakening. <i><b>Sustained</b> flight.</i>
<b>tireless</b>	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. <i>A <b>tireless</b> worker.</i>
<b>unbendable</b>	Not able to be changed or adapted. <i>Obeying his commands with <b>unbendable</b> allegiance.</i>
<b>unfaltering</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i>Her <b>unfaltering</b> energy and determination.</i>
<b>unflagging</b>	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i><b>Unflagging</b> courtesy.</i>
<b>unfluctuating</b>	Not liable to fluctuate or especially to fall.
<b>unhesitating</b>	Characterized by quickness and firmness. <i>Unequivocal and <b>unhesitating</b> condemnation.</i>
<b>unrelenting</b>	Not yielding in strength, severity, or determination. <i><b>Unrelenting</b> opponents.</i>

<b>unremitting</b>	Never relaxing or slackening; incessant. <i>Unremitting drizzle.</i>
<b>unshakable</b>	Without flaws or loopholes.
<b>unshakeable</b>	Without flaws or loopholes. <i>My unshakeable faith in the goodness of mankind.</i>
<b>unswerving</b>	Going directly ahead from one point to another without veering or turning aside. <i>Unswerving allegiance.</i>
<b>untiring</b>	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. <i>His untiring efforts in commissioning ecological reports.</i>
<b>unyielding</b>	Stubbornly unyielding. <i>An unyielding head support.</i>

<b>incessant</b>	(of something regarded as unpleasant) continuing without pause or interruption. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>intransigent</b>	An intransigent person. <i>An <b>intransigent</b> conservative opposed to every liberal tendency.</i>
<b>invariable</b>	Never changing. <i>His routine was <b>invariable</b>.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Stubbornly unyielding- T.S.Eliot. <i><b>Persistent</b> leaves remain attached past maturity.</i>
<b>relentless</b>	Harsh or inflexible. <i>The <b>relentless</b> heat of the desert.</i>
<b>resolute</b>	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>He was <b>resolute</b> in his fight to uphold liberal values.</i>
<b>solid</b>	A substance or object that is solid rather than liquid or fluid. <i><b>Solid</b> color.</i>
<b>stable</b>	Shelter in a stable. <i>The economy is <b>stable</b>.</i>
<b>staunch</b>	Very loyal and committed in attitude. <i><b>Staunch</b> the blood flow.</i>
<b>steadfast</b>	Resolutely or dutifully firm and unwavering. <i>A <b>steadfast</b> ally.</i>
<b>steady</b>	Make or become steady. <i>A solid <b>steady</b> young man.</i>
<b>stiff</b>	In a stiff manner. <i>Ordinary working <b>stiffs</b> in respectable offices.</i>
<b>stubborn</b>	Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. <i>Two <b>stubborn</b> young people intent on doing their own thing.</i>
<b>tenacious</b>	Sticking together. <i>A mind not gifted to discover truth but <b>tenacious</b> to hold it.</i>
<b>unbending</b>	Reserved, formal, or strict in one's behaviour or attitudes; austere and inflexible. <i>His output is prodigious and springs from the <b>unbending</b> control he exercises over every aspect of his life.</i>
