<u>abominate</u>	Find repugnant. <i>They abominated the very idea of monarchy.</i>
attitude	A theatrical pose created for effect. <i>The actor struck just the right attitude.</i>
averse	(usually followed by `to') strongly opposed. <i>As a former CIA director he is not averse to secrecy.</i>
<u>avert</u>	Turn away or aside. <i>They averted their eyes when the King entered.</i>
<u>defiance</u>	Open resistance; bold disobedience. <i>The demonstration was held in defiance of official warnings.</i>
<u>detest</u>	Dislike intensely. <i>She really did detest his mockery.</i>
disinclination	A reluctance or lack of enthusiasm. <i>Lucy felt a strong disinclination to talk about her engagement.</i>
disinclined	Unwilling; reluctant. <i>The rural community was disinclined to abandon the old ways.</i>
dislike	Have or feel a dislike or distaste for. <i>I know all his likes and dislikes.</i>
grudging	(of a person) reluctant or resentfully unwilling to give or allow something. <i>A grudging admirer.</i>
hate	Dislike intensely; feel antipathy or aversion towards. <i>I hate Mexican food.</i>
hesitance	A feeling of diffidence and indecision about doing something. <i>They agreed to go along after initial hesitance.</i>
hesitancy	A feeling of diffidence and indecision about doing something. <i>His hesitancy revealed his basic indisposition.</i>

hesitant	Tentative, unsure, or slow in acting or speaking. <i>Clients are hesitant about buying.</i>
hesitantly	In a tentative or unsure manner. <i>He finally accepted hesitantly.</i>
hesitating	Tentative, unsure, or slow in acting or speaking. <i>His hesitating delivery.</i>
hesitatingly	With hesitation; in a hesitant manner.
<u>indecisive</u>	Characterized by lack of decision and firmness. <i>An indecisive battle.</i>
irresolution	Hesitancy; uncertainty. <i>A moment of irresolution.</i>
loath	Unwillingness to do something contrary to your custom. <i>I was loath to leave.</i>
<u>loathe</u>	Find repugnant. <i>She loathed him on sight.</i>
lurk	Wait in hiding to attack. <i>Danger lurks beneath the surface.</i>
negatively	In a harmful manner. <i>Women who originally tested negatively for the hepatitis C virus.</i>
reluctant	Unwilling and hesitant; disinclined. <i>Reluctant to help.</i>
reluctantly	In an unwilling and hesitant way. <i>He reluctantly agrees to do his duty.</i>
skulk	Move stealthily or furtively. <i>The lonely man skulks down the main street all day.</i>
<u>unintentional</u>	Done or made or performed with purpose and intent. <i>An unintentional pun.</i>
<u>unwilling</u>	Not disposed or inclined toward. <i>An unwilling smile.</i>
unwillingness	The quality or state of being unwilling to do something; reluctance. <i>His unwillingness to cooperate vetoed every proposal I made.</i>
vacillating	Uncertain in purpose or action. <i>He was accused of vacillating leadership.</i>
