airy	Delicate, as though filled with or made of air. <i>Airy rooms.</i>
beaming	Smiling broadly; grinning. <i>The beaming sun.</i>
breezy	Fresh and animated. <i>It was a bright breezy day.</i>
bright	Not made dim or less bright. <i>The sun was bright and hot.</i>
bubbly	(of a person) full of cheerful high spirits. <i>A bright and bubbly personality.</i>

carefree	Cheerfully irresponsible. <i>Carefree</i> millionaires untroubled financially.
<u>cheerful</u>	Being full of or promoting cheer; having or showing good spirits. <i>How can she be so cheerful at six o'clock in the morning.</i>
cheery	Happy and optimistic. <i>A cheery hello.</i>
<u>ebullient</u>	(of liquid or matter) boiling or agitated as if boiling. <i>Misted and ebullient seas.</i>
<u>effervescent</u>	Used of wines and waters; charged naturally or artificially with carbon dioxide. <i>His fertile effervescent mind.</i>
exuberant	Characterized by a vigorously imaginative artistic style. <i>Exuberant compliments.</i>
grinning	Smiling broadly. <i>A grinning skull.</i>
happy	Used in greetings. <i>I'm happy with his performance.</i>
in good spirits	Directed or bound inward.
in high spirits	Holding office.
jaunty	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air. <i>There was no mistaking that jaunty walk.</i>
<u>jolly</u>	Lively and entertaining. <i>He was a jolly man full of jokes.</i>
<u>joyous</u>	Full of happiness and joy. <i>Scenes of joyous celebration.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
light-hearted	Carefree and happy and lighthearted.
<u>merry</u>	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment- Wordsworth. <i>After the third beer he began to feel quite merry.</i>
mirthful	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment. <i>A mirthful experience.</i>
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>He praised her radiant self confidence.</i>
smiling	Smiling with happiness or optimism. <i>Smiling groves and terraces.</i>

sparkling (of a drink) effervescent; fizzy.
***Sparkling** dialogue.*

sprightly Full of spirit and vitality.
*She was quite **sprightly** for her age.*

sunny (of a person or their temperament) cheery and bright.
*A **sunny** smile.*
