Associations of "Up and coming" (30 Words)

above	In or to a place that is higher. <i>The two cases described above.</i>
ascend	Become king or queen. <i>The mountaineers slowly ascended the steep slope.</i>
ascending	Sloping or leading upwards. <i>Blood pressure in the ascending aorta.</i>
ascent	An instance of rising or moving up through the air. <i>The first ascent of the Matterhorn.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>He gave her a boost over the fence.</i>
climb	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>Did you ever climb up the hill behind your house.</i>
climbing	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>Climbing equipment.</i>
elevate	Raise or lift (something) to a higher position. <i>The exercise will naturally elevate your chest and head.</i>
elevator	A platform or compartment housed in a shaft for raising and lowering people or things to different levels; a lift. <i>First you trim the rudder then the ailerons and finally the elevator.</i>
emergence	The act of emerging. <i>I misjudged the timing of my emergence.</i>
escalator	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
hoist	Raise or haul up. <i>Hoist a sail.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>I laddered my tights as I arrived this morning.</i>

lift	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>This is a hackneyed adventure lifted straight from a vintage Lassie episode.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i>
<u>preceding</u>	Existing or coming before. <i>The preceding pages.</i>
<u>precipitate</u>	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>The crisis precipitated by Russia's revolution.</i>
prefatory	Serving as an introduction; introductory. <i>In his prefatory remarks the author claims that.</i>
raise	Raise the level or amount of something. <i>The President raised several million dollars for his college.</i>
rise	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>Leave the dough in a warm place to rise.</i>
risen	Above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	Advancing to maturity or high standing. <i>The Warsaw rising of 1944.</i>
scale	Come off in scales or thin pieces flake off. <i>This model must be scaled down.</i>
<u>soar</u>	The act of rising upward into the air. <i>When she heard his voice her spirits soared.</i>
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
uphill	Against difficulties. <i>Follow the track uphill.</i>
upstairs	An upper floor. <i>An upstairs bedroom.</i>
upward	Towards a higher place, point, or level. <i>She peered upward at the sky.</i>
<u>zoom</u>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>Bikes zoomed past.</i>
