<b>above</b>	In or to a place that is higher. <i>The two cases described <b>above</b>.</i>
<b>ascend</b>	Become king or queen. <i>The mountaineers slowly <b>ascended</b> the steep slope.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	Sloping or leading upwards. <i>Blood pressure in the <b>ascending</b> aorta.</i>
<b>ascent</b>	An instance of rising or moving up through the air. <i>The first <b>ascent</b> of the Matterhorn.</i>
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>He gave her a <b>boost</b> over the fence.</i>
<a href="#">climb</a>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>Did you ever <b>climb</b> up the hill behind your house.</i>
<a href="#">climbing</a>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i><b>Climbing</b> equipment.</i>
<a href="#">elevate</a>	Raise or lift (something) to a higher position. <i>The exercise will naturally <b>elevate</b> your chest and head.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	A platform or compartment housed in a shaft for raising and lowering people or things to different levels; a lift. <i>First you trim the rudder then the ailerons and finally the <b>elevator</b>.</i>
<a href="#">emergence</a>	The act of emerging. <i>I misjudged the timing of my <b>emergence</b>.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
<a href="#">hoist</a>	Raise or haul up. <i><b>Hoist</b> a sail.</i>
<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>I <b>laddered</b> my tights as I arrived this morning.</i>

<b>lift</b>	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>This is a hackneyed adventure <b>lifted</b> straight from a vintage Lassie episode.</i>
<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>
<b><u>preceding</u></b>	Existing or coming before. <i>The <b>preceding</b> pages.</i>
<b><u>precipitate</u></b>	A precipitated solid substance in suspension or after settling or filtering. <i>The crisis <b>precipitated</b> by Russia's revolution.</i>
<b>prefatory</b>	Serving as an introduction; introductory. <i>In his <b>prefatory</b> remarks the author claims that.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Raise the level or amount of something. <i>The President <b>raised</b> several million dollars for his college.</i>
<b>rise</b>	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>Leave the dough in a warm place to <b>rise</b>.</i>
<b>risen</b>	Above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rising</b>	Advancing to maturity or high standing. <i>The Warsaw <b>rising</b> of 1944.</i>
<b>scale</b>	Come off in scales or thin pieces flake off. <i>This model must be <b>scaled</b> down.</i>
<b><u>soar</u></b>	The act of rising upward into the air. <i>When she heard his voice her spirits <b>soared</b>.</i>
<b>stairs</b>	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
<b>stepladder</b>	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
<b>uphill</b>	Against difficulties. <i>Follow the track <b>uphill</b>.</i>
<b>upstairs</b>	An upper floor. <i>An <b>upstairs</b> bedroom.</i>
<b>upward</b>	Towards a higher place, point, or level. <i>She peered <b>upward</b> at the sky.</i>
<b><u>zoom</u></b>	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>Bikes <b>zoomed</b> past.</i>
