ascend	(of a voice or sound) rise in pitch. She ascend ed from a life of poverty to one of great renown.
ascending	The act of changing location in an upward direction. The ascending stems of chickweed.
ascent	An upward slope or grade (as in a road. <i>His ascent to power.</i>
<u>climb</u>	An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. This may be the hardest rock climb in the world.
<u>climbing</u>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>Climbing</i> equipment.
descending	Moving down a scale of quality. A rocky descending path.
downstairs	Situated downstairs. The downstairs loo.
downward	Towards a lower place, point, or level. New rules on sick leave affect employees of all grades from managers downward s.
<u>elevate</u>	Raise from a lower to a higher position. The exercise will naturally elevate your chest and head.
elevator	A machine consisting of an endless belt with scoops attached, used for raising grain to an upper storey for storage. In the elevator she pressed the button for the lobby.
escalator	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
<u>falling</u>	Coming down freely under the influence of gravity. <i>Falling</i> temperature.



<u>height</u>	The distance from head to foot. <i>He s terrified of heights.</i>
high	Highly. People in high places.
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. The first time I put them on one of the stockings ladder ed.
lift	Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building. He lift ed a war whoop.
low	Below average in amount extent or intensity. Practise a little low cunning.
<u>precipitate</u>	A substance precipitated from a solution. They were precipitate d into a conflict for which they were quite unprepared.
raise	Raise the level or amount of something. <i>He wants a raise and some perks.</i>
rise	Rise in rank or status. I gained the crest of a rise and saw the plain stretched out before me.
risen	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	(of a sign) ascendant. The Warsaw rising of 1944.
scale	Measure by or as if by a scale. The scale of the model.
<u>soar</u>	Fly or rise high in the air. The stock market soar ed after the cease fire was announced.
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
uphill	Against difficulties. An uphill struggle to gain worldwide recognition.
upstairs	An upper floor. No one was allowed to see the upstairs .
upward	Extending or moving toward a higher place. From childhood upward .
vertically	In a vertical direction. The wheel hangs vertically from a wire.
