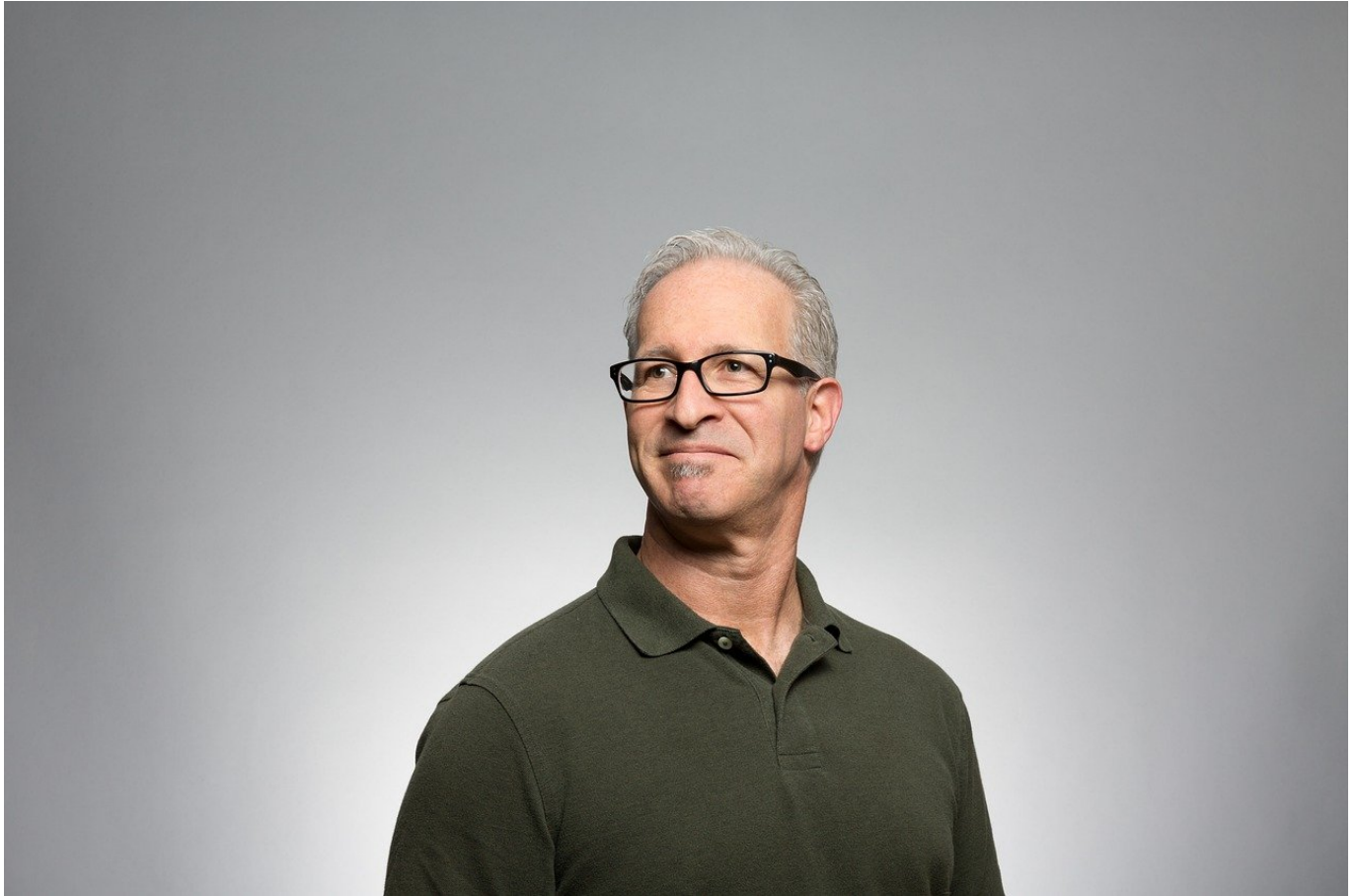

<b>bright</b>	Made smooth and bright by or as if by rubbing reflecting a sheen or glow. <i>She gave a <b>bright</b> smile.</i>
<b>bullish</b>	Expecting a rise in prices. <i>We are very <b>bullish</b> about our prospects.</i>
<b>buoyant</b>	Tending to float on a liquid or rise in air or gas. <i><b>Buoyant</b> water.</i>
<b>cheerful</b>	Being full of or promoting cheer; having or showing good spirits. <i>The room was painted in <b>cheerful</b> colours.</i>

<b>pollyannaish</b>	Pleasantly (even unrealistically) optimistic.
<b>positive</b>	Having a positive charge. <i>The <b>positive</b> results of a pregnancy test.</i>
<b>sanguine</b>	Confidently optimistic and cheerful. <i>A fresh and <b>sanguine</b> complexion.</i>

<b>affirmative</b>	Relating to or denoting proposed legislation which must receive a parliamentary vote in its favour before it can come into force. <i>An <b>affirmative</b> outlook.</i>
<b>amiability</b>	A cheerful and agreeable mood. <i>His good natured <b>amiability</b>.</i>
<b>approving</b>	The formal act of approving. <i>The wine drew <b>approving</b> comments from across the table.</i>
<b>assured</b>	Marked by assurance; exhibiting confidence. <i>A tiny but <b>assured</b> income.</i>

<b>blithe</b>	Lacking or showing a lack of due concern. <i>A merry <b>blithesome</b> nature.</i>

<u><b>certainly</b></u>	Used to express complete agreement with something that has just been said. <i>The prestigious address <b>certainly</b> adds to the firm's appeal.</i>
<u><b>cheerful</b></u>	Pleasantly (even unrealistically) optimistic. <i>As <b>cheerful</b> as anyone confined to a hospital bed could be.</i>
<b>cheerfulness</b>	The quality of causing happiness. <i>The <b>cheerfulness</b> from the fire.</i>
<b>cocksure</b>	Marked by excessive confidence. <i>An arrogant and <b>cocksure</b> materialist.</i>
<b>confident</b>	Feeling or showing certainty about something. <i>This time they're <b>confident</b> of a happy ending.</i>
<b>convinced</b>	Persuaded of; very sure. <i>Were <b>convinced</b> that it would be to their advantage to join.</i>
<b>extroverted</b>	Being concerned with the social and physical environment. <i>She is <b>extroverted</b> confident and gives rousing lectures.</i>
<u><b>favorable</b></u>	Presaging or likely to bring good luck or a good outcome. <i>The days were fair and the winds were <b>favorable</b>.</i>
<u><b>genial</b></u>	Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw. <i>Our <b>genial</b> host.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Inclined to use a specified thing excessively or at random. <i>Melissa came in looking <b>happy</b> and excited.</i>
<b>hilarity</b>	Boisterous merriment. <i>By midnight the <b>hilarity</b> had increased.</i>
<u><b>lighthearted</b></u>	Carefree and happy and lighthearted. <i>Her <b>lighthearted</b> nature.</i>
<b>lucky</b>	Occurring by chance. <i>A <b>lucky</b> man.</i>
<b>melodious</b>	Having a musical sound; especially a pleasing tune. <i>He heard a fruity <b>melodious</b> voice.</i>
<b>optimism</b>	The belief that good must ultimately prevail over evil in the universe. <i>The talks had been amicable and there were grounds for <b>optimism</b>.</i>



<b>optimist</b>	A person disposed to take a favorable view of things. <i>Only an eternal <b>optimist</b> could expect success.</i>
<b><u>optimistic</u></b>	Expecting the best. <i>The government was <b>optimistic</b> that reform would take place.</i>
<b>positive</b>	A positive photographic image especially one printed from a negative. <i>Adopt a <b>positive</b> outlook on life.</i>
<b>sanguine</b>	Confidently optimistic and cheerful. <i>He is <b>sanguine</b> about prospects for the global economy.</i>
<b>sunshine</b>	Moderate weather; suitable for outdoor activities. <i>Their colourful music can bring a ray of <b>sunshine</b>.</i>
<b><u>sure</u></b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>Was <b>sure</b> or certain she had seen it.</i>
<b>unencumbered</b>	Free of debt or other financial liability. <i>Living an <b>unencumbered</b> life.</i>
<b>upside</b>	The more positive aspect of a situation. <i>Being self employed has its <b>upside</b>.</i>
<b>wellbeing</b>	A contented state of being happy and healthy and prosperous.
