eudaemonia A contented state of being happy and healthy and prosperous.

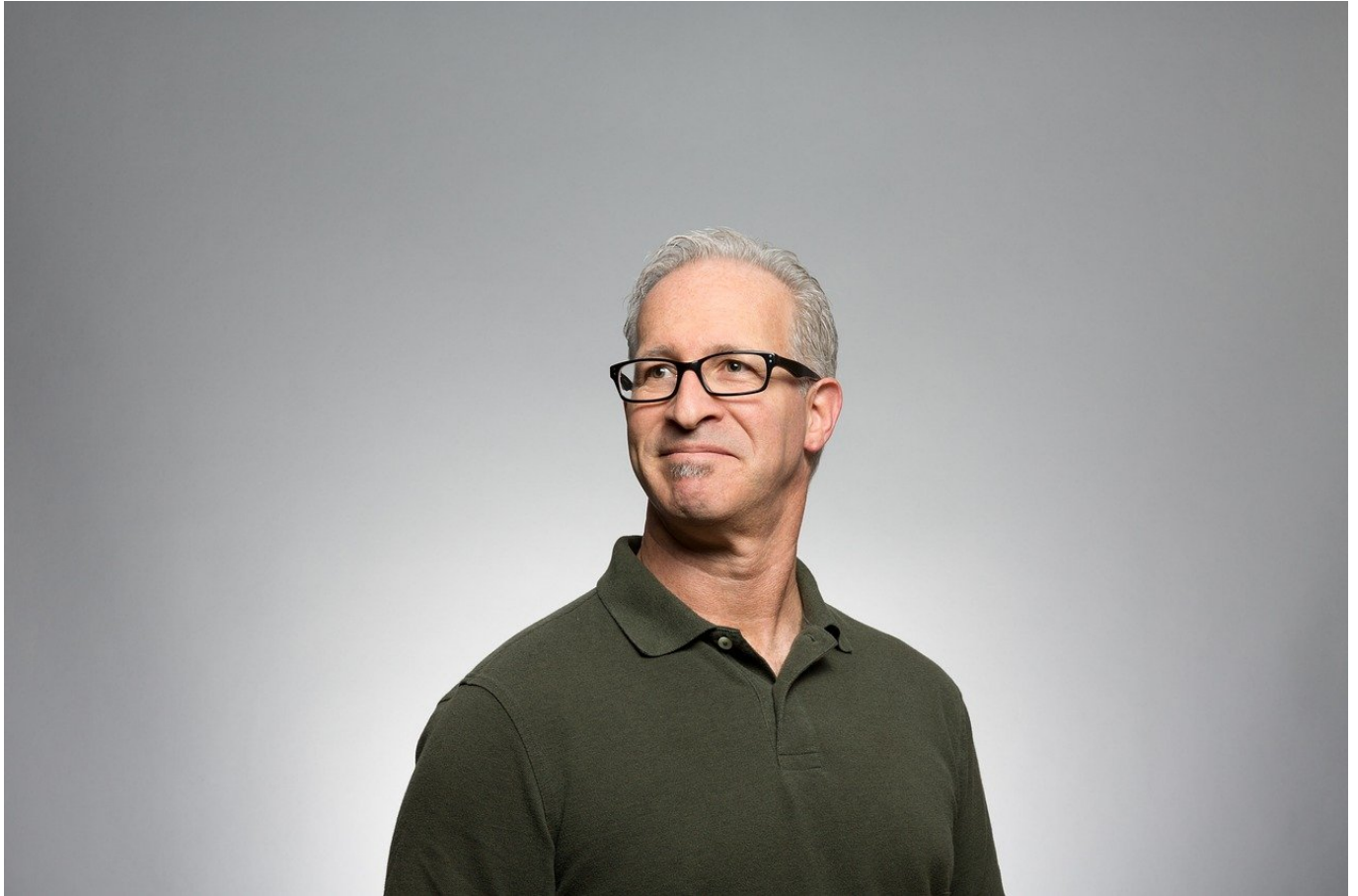

bright	Made smooth and bright by or as if by rubbing reflecting a sheen or glow. <i>She gave a bright smile.</i>
bullish	Expecting a rise in prices. <i>We are very bullish about our prospects.</i>
buoyant	Tending to float on a liquid or rise in air or gas. <i>Buoyant water.</i>
cheerful	Being full of or promoting cheer; having or showing good spirits. <i>The room was painted in cheerful colours.</i>
cheery	Happy and optimistic. <i>A cheery hello.</i>
confident	Feeling or showing confidence in oneself or one's abilities or qualities. <i>A confident reply.</i>
hopeful	Having or manifesting hope. <i>Found a hopeful way of attacking the problem.</i>
pollyannaish	Pleasantly (even unrealistically) optimistic.
positive	Having a positive charge. <i>The positive results of a pregnancy test.</i>
sanguine	Confidently optimistic and cheerful. <i>A fresh and sanguine complexion.</i>

<u>affirmative</u>	Relating to or denoting proposed legislation which must receive a parliamentary vote in its favour before it can come into force. <i>An affirmative outlook.</i>
amiability	A cheerful and agreeable mood. <i>His good natured amiability.</i>
approving	The formal act of approving. <i>The wine drew approving comments from across the table.</i>
assured	Marked by assurance; exhibiting confidence. <i>A tiny but assured income.</i>

blithe	Lacking or showing a lack of due concern. <i>A merry blithesome nature.</i>
bullish	Aggressively confident and self-assertive. <i>High points in the stock market cycle when investors are at their most bullish.</i>
<u>certainly</u>	Used to express complete agreement with something that has just been said. <i>The prestigious address certainly adds to the firm's appeal.</i>
<u>cheerful</u>	Pleasantly (even unrealistically) optimistic. <i>As cheerful as anyone confined to a hospital bed could be.</i>
cheerfulness	The quality of causing happiness. <i>The cheerfulness from the fire.</i>
cocksure	Marked by excessive confidence. <i>An arrogant and cocksure materialist.</i>
confident	Feeling or showing certainty about something. <i>This time they're confident of a happy ending.</i>
convinced	Persuaded of; very sure. <i>Were convinced that it would be to their advantage to join.</i>
extroverted	Being concerned with the social and physical environment. <i>She is extroverted confident and gives rousing lectures.</i>
<u>favorable</u>	Presaging or likely to bring good luck or a good outcome. <i>The days were fair and the winds were favorable.</i>
<u>genial</u>	Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw. <i>Our genial host.</i>
happy	Inclined to use a specified thing excessively or at random. <i>Melissa came in looking happy and excited.</i>
hilarity	Boisterous merriment. <i>By midnight the hilarity had increased.</i>
<u>lighthearted</u>	Carefree and happy and lighthearted. <i>Her lighthearted nature.</i>
lucky	Occurring by chance. <i>A lucky man.</i>
melodious	Having a musical sound; especially a pleasing tune. <i>He heard a fruity melodious voice.</i>
optimism	The belief that good must ultimately prevail over evil in the universe. <i>The talks had been amicable and there were grounds for optimism.</i>

optimist	A person disposed to take a favorable view of things. <i>Only an eternal optimist could expect success.</i>
<u>optimistic</u>	Expecting the best. <i>The government was optimistic that reform would take place.</i>
positive	A positive photographic image especially one printed from a negative. <i>Adopt a positive outlook on life.</i>
sanguine	Confidently optimistic and cheerful. <i>He is sanguine about prospects for the global economy.</i>
sunshine	Moderate weather; suitable for outdoor activities. <i>Their colourful music can bring a ray of sunshine.</i>
<u>sure</u>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>Was sure or certain she had seen it.</i>
unencumbered	Free of debt or other financial liability. <i>Living an unencumbered life.</i>
upside	The more positive aspect of a situation. <i>Being self employed has its upside.</i>
wellbeing	A contented state of being happy and healthy and prosperous.
