### Definitions of "Upfront" as an adjective

- *Frank and honest.*
- *(of a payment) made in advance.*
- *Bold, honest, and frank.*
- *At the front or the most prominent position.*

### Synonyms of "Upfront" as an adjective (7 Words)

<b><u>candid</u></b>	Truthful and straightforward; frank. <i>I gave them my <b>candid</b> opinion.</i>
<b>frank</b>	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. <i>To be perfectly <b>frank</b> I don't know.</i>

<b>honest</b>	Not disposed to cheat or defraud; not deceptive or fraudulent. <i>I haven't been totally <b>honest</b> with you.</i>
<b>on the level</b>	Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss.
<b>open</b>	Open and observable not secret or hidden. <i>An <b>open</b> protest.</i>
<b>sincere</b>	Open and genuine; not deceitful. <i>Felt <b>sincere</b> regret that they were leaving.</i>
<b>truthful</b>	Telling or expressing the truth; honest. <i>Astonishingly <b>truthful</b> acting.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Upfront" as an adjective

- *He was upfront about his intentions.*
- *An upfront fee of 4.*
- *He'd been upfront about his intentions.*
- *A literary weekly with an upfront section modelled on the New Yorker.*

## Upfront as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Upfront" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "upfront" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *(of a payment) in advance.*
- *At the front; in front.*

### Synonyms of "Upfront" as an adverb (10 Words)

<b>ahead</b>	Ahead of time in anticipation. <i>I like to look <b>ahead</b> in imagination to what the future may bring.</i>
<b>ahead of time</b>	Ahead of time in anticipation.
<b>beforehand</b>	Ahead of time; in anticipation. <i>Should have made reservations <b>beforehand</b>.</i>
<b>in advance</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in readiness</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in the lead</b>	To or toward the inside of.

**in the van** To or toward the inside of.

**in the vanguard** To or toward the inside of.

**to the fore** Near or toward the bow of a ship or cockpit of a plane.

**up ahead** To a more central or a more northerly place.

### **Usage Examples of "Upfront" as an adverb**

- *The salesmen are paid commission up front.*
- *He can play up front or in defence.*
