
#### Definitions of "Upgrade" as a noun

- An improved or more modern version of something, especially a piece of computing equipment.
- A reservation that is improved.
- The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises.
- An act of upgrading something.
- Hardware that provides better performance than an earlier version did.
- Software that provides better performance than an earlier version did.
- An upward slope or grade (as in a road.
- The act of improving something (especially machinery) by raising it to a higher grade



(as by adding or replacing components.

#### Definitions of "Upgrade" as a verb

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "upgrade" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Give a promotion to or assign to a higher position.*
- To improve what was old or outdated.
- Raise (an employee) to a higher grade or rank.
- Give better travel conditions to.
- Get better travel conditions.
- Rate higher; raise in value or esteem.
- Raise (something) to a higher standard, in particular improve (equipment or machinery) by adding or replacing components.



advancement	The promotion of a person in rank or status. <i>Technological advancements</i> .
augmentation	The amount by which something increases. The <b>augmentation</b> of the curriculum with new subjects.
automation	The use or introduction of automatic equipment in a manufacturing or other process or facility. Unemployment due to the spread of <b>automation</b> .
develop	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. I <b>develop</b> ed an interest in law.
<u>elevate</u>	Raise from a lower to a higher position. She ordered the bishop celebrating Mass in her chapel not to <b>elevate</b> the Host.
<u>enrich</u>	Improve or enhance the quality or value of. They announced they would resume building the centrifuges that can <b>enrich</b> uranium to weapons grade strength.
exalt	Praise, glorify, or honor. These paintings <b>exalt</b> the imagination.
forwarding	The act of sending on to another destination. His experience in marketing resulted in the <b>forwarding</b> of his career.
furtherance	The advancement of some enterprise. The court held that the union s acts were not in <b>furtherance</b> of a trade dispute.
improve	Get better. The weather <b>improve</b> d toward evening.
increase	The amount by which something increases. The <b>increase</b> is scheduled for next month.
industrialization	The development of industry on an extensive scale. <i>These developing countries have undergone rapid industrialization</i> .
industrialize	Develop industries in (a country or region) on a wide scale. The nations of South East Asia will quickly <b>industrialize</b> and catch up with the West.
liberalize	Make liberal or more liberal, of laws and rules. The laws <b>liberalize</b> d after Prohibition.
mechanization	The action or process of making something mechanical in character. Both characters are portrayed by Dickens as complicit in the <b>mechanization</b> of human beings.



<u>modernize</u>	Become technologically advanced. <i>He <b>modernize</b>d the health service.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>
<u>precipitate</u>	A substance precipitated from a solution. I must apologize for my staff their actions were <b>precipitate</b> .
preferment	The act of making accusations. After ordination <b>preferment</b> was fast.
progress	Cause a task or undertaking to make progress. The darkness did not stop my <b>progress</b> .
promotion	A publicity campaign. United won <b>promotion</b> last season.
raise	Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3. North <b>raise</b> s to three no trumps.
redecorate	Redo the decoration of an apartment or house. You will have to <b>redecorate</b> the room afterwards.
<u>refurbish</u>	Renovate and redecorate (something, especially a building. The premises have been completely <b>refurbish</b> ed in our corporate style.
renovate	Refresh; reinvigorate. The old school has been tastefully <b>renovate</b> d as a private house.
rise	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>The sun had just <b>rise</b>n.</i>
sophisticate	Make someone or something more sophisticated. <i>He is still the butt of jokes made by New York <b>sophisticate</b>s.</i>
